Twenty-three Clackamas county dairy herds made an average production exceeding 40 pounds of butter fat for the month of June according to the reports of DHIA testers, Milton Corum, L. C. Berney and Richard Gale.

Sandy area owners of these high producing herds are: M. A. Beamish, Damascus, 43.7 pounds; R. C. Aitchison, Sandy, 50.1 pounds and Dr. J. B. Harrison, Eagle Creek, 46.7 pounds.

Individual cows who made high production records of 75 or more pounds of fat for the 30 days in June are: Mamie, a registered Jersey owned by R. C. Aitchison, with 88.7 pounds; White Back, Frannie, Norma and Judy, registered Holsteins owned by Dr. J. B. Harrison, with 84.2, 95, 83.9 and 81.6 pounds.

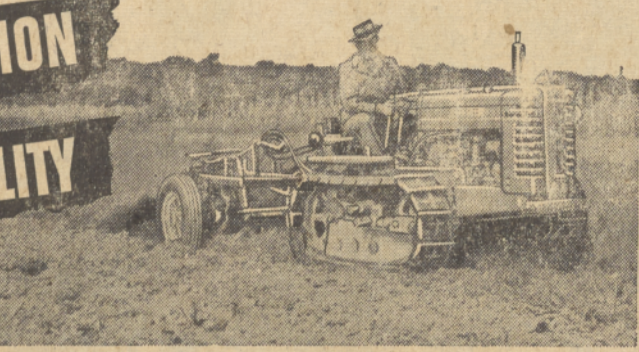

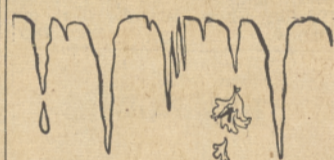
