LADIES**FIRST!**

"In 30 years of married life the dishes stack up a pile twice as high as the Empire State building, or an estimated 340 tons, of plates, cups, glasses, pots and pans. Not counting silverware."

This blood-chilling statement leaped out at us from the stack of usually dull "canned copy" which comes on to the desk by the carload. We were stunned. Thunderstruck. Most of all we were overcome by deadly fatigue at the thought of 296 tons of dishes still ahead of us.

But, wait! Before you break that engagement, before you decide to leave it all, before you decide you'll forevermore use paper plates or chain your husband to the kitchen sink—wait! There's a ray of hope.

One answer is an automatic dishwasher. With that out of the way, there's another answer for the 99.99 per cent of us who still do dishes in a pan of hot water and suds.

Segregation is the first order for time saving in dish washing. Separate glasses, cups and saucers and silverware. Place the garbage pail on a stool and remove food from plates. Rinse sticky dishes under the faucet. The usual order of glasses and silverware first, winding up with the cooking utensils, is still considered the most efficient. No water changes.

Rubber gloves, they say, not only save your hands but permit use of much hotter water. Placed in a rinsing rack (best rubber covered to save your china) dishes should be sprayed with hot water from a faucet attachment or poured from a kettle.

Those nasty pans are the biggest time-killers. To cut down on scrubbing time be sure they're scraped with a good scraper, washed as soon as possible or soaked in hot water if not possible. Watching to prevent boil-overs will also cut down on pan scrubbing.

To dry or not to dry is a big question. Manufacturers of the new detergents say it's not necessary with their products. Unfortunately for us time-savers, the experts says dishes should be dried with a towel. Keep good absorbent towels handy, rinse the dishes in very hot water, and your drying time can be cut to a minimum.

While we groan over not having one of those gleaming white machines which automatically

take over the dish washing chore, be comforted by these facts: dishwasher owners still have to scrape the dishes; they still have to rinse them with hot water first; and it takes quite a few minutes to place them in the racks so they won't be whizzing about the machine.

Coming right down to it, about the only real advantage of a dish washer is that it keeps your hands out of hot water. You can always use those rubber gloves or better yet, your husband.
