Recipe Of The Week

Fried chicken, roast chicken, chicken stew—fried, roasted, stewed. Everybody likes chicken but—fried, roasted, stewed—it gets a little monotonous fixed the same old ways.

So here's something new—"Chicken Continental." It's different, has an exotic name and tastes very a la fancaise. It's even easy, so if you're a new bride you might try it on your first company dinner and knock your mother-in-law for a loop.

Ingredients: 3 1/2 pound fryer; 1/2 cup flour; 1 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper; 1/2 cup salad oil; 2 cloves garlic minced or 1 small onion minced; 1/4 cup green pepper chopped; 2 cups tomatoes (canned); 1 small can tomato paste and 1 bay leaf with 1/4 teaspoon thyme.

Mix flour, salt, pepper—dredge the chicken pieces in the mixture. Put oil in skillet, heat. Brown chicken on both sides. Set aside.

Cook green pepper, garlic or onion, in the hot oil five minutes. Add tomatoes and tomato paste. Add bay leaf, thyme. Put chicken in pan with tomato mixture. Cover. Simmer over low heat 1 1/2 hours. When chicken is tender, serve at once.



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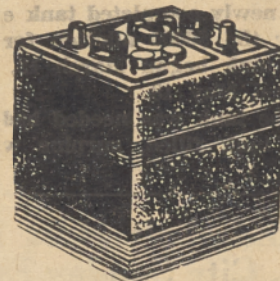
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
