Women Voters Start Work On Friday, Sept. 8

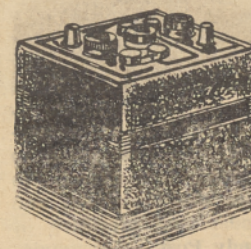
