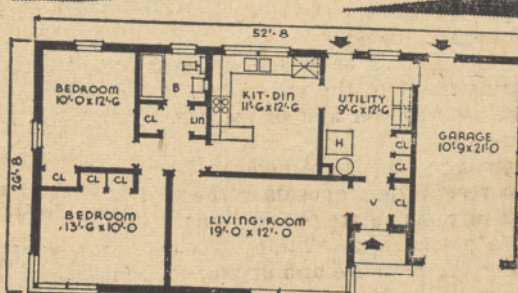
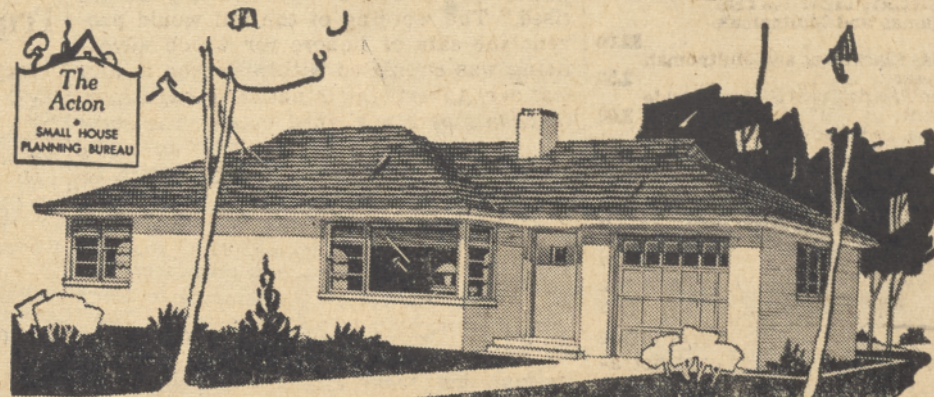

All rooms open into the bedroom hall for free movement, and it is also possible to reach the front door, by-passing the living room. Closet space is well distributed with two closets, one for linen in the hall, coat closets for both entrances, shallow wardrobe closets in bedrooms and storage closet and cabinet in utility room.

A double compartment sink is centrally located between stove on left and refrigerator on right. There is also a snack bar and dining space in kitchen.

Overall dimensions are 52 feet, 8 inches by 26 feet, 8 inches. Floor area is 1,040 and cubage 12,220 cubic feet.
