Returning to San Diego upon completion of a short leave, Private First Class Gilmore will be transferred to one of the Marine Corps duty assignments.

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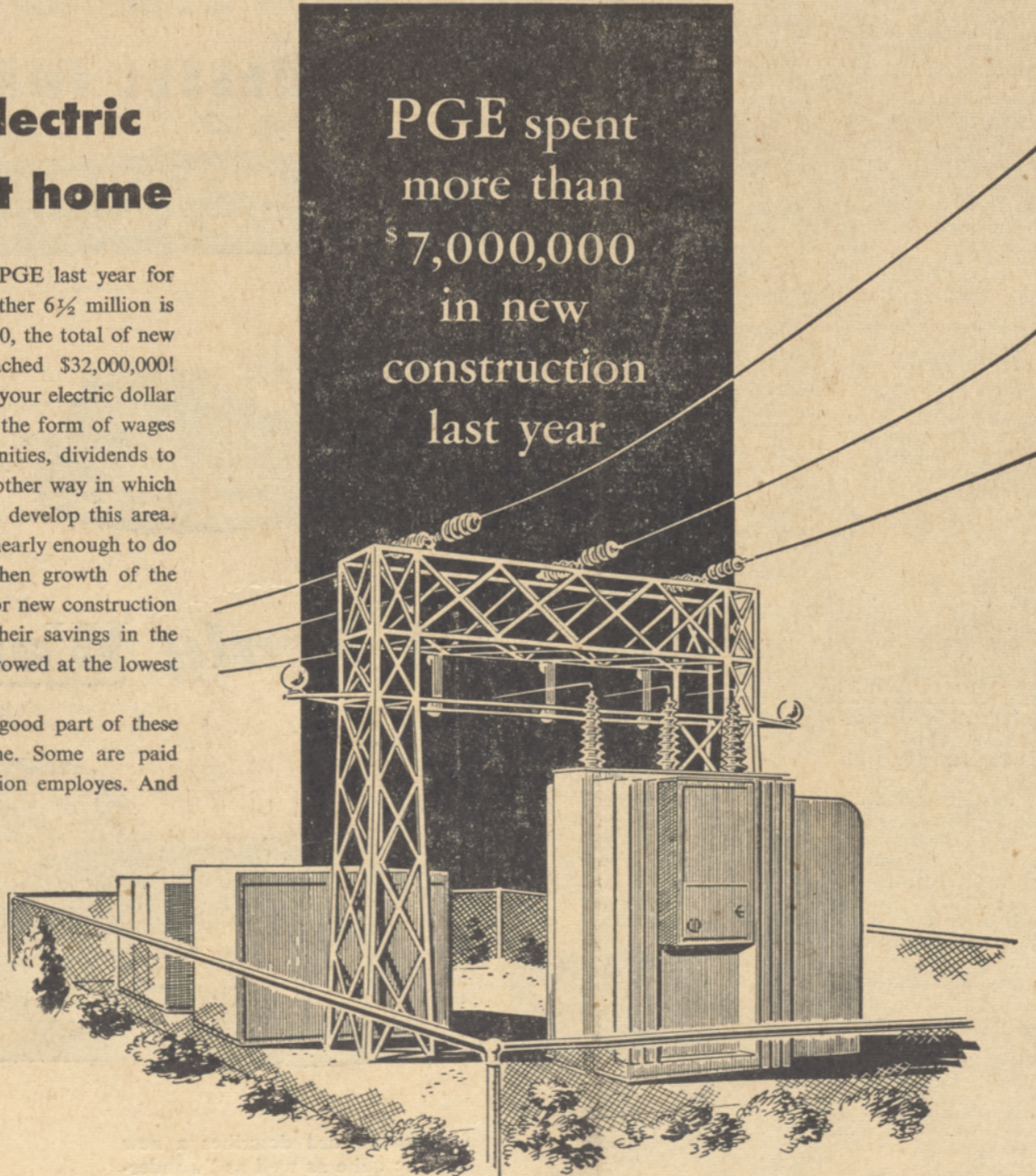
