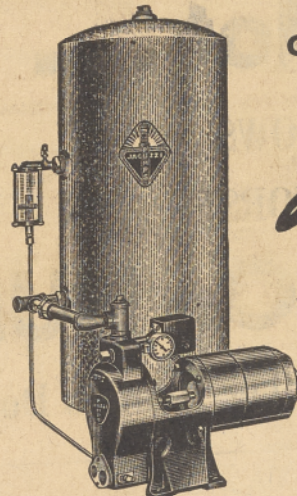

18 Million Of O. & C. Timber To Be Auctioned

Eighteen million board feet of timber located upon six separate tracts of land in Polk, Clackamas, and Benton counties, with an estimated value in excess of \$283,000, will be offered for sale by the Bureau of Land Management on October 9th and 10th. Upon October 9th an oral auction sale will be conducted in the office of the District Forester in Salem for the timber located in Clackamas and Polk Counties amounting to six million board feet, while sealed bids will be opened in the office of the Regional Administrator in Portland on October 10th for two tracts of timber in Benton County with an estimated volume of twelve million board feet.

The Salem Forest District includes Public Domain and O. & C. lands in the 12 northwestern counties of Oregon, with the exception of Clatsop County. Other oral auction sales of timber during the week of October 9th to 13th will be conducted in the other forest district headquarters located in Eugene, Roseburg, Medford, and Coos Bay.

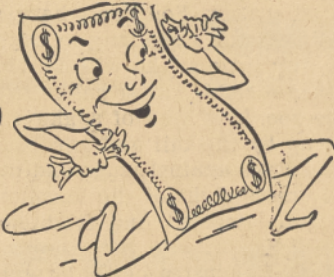

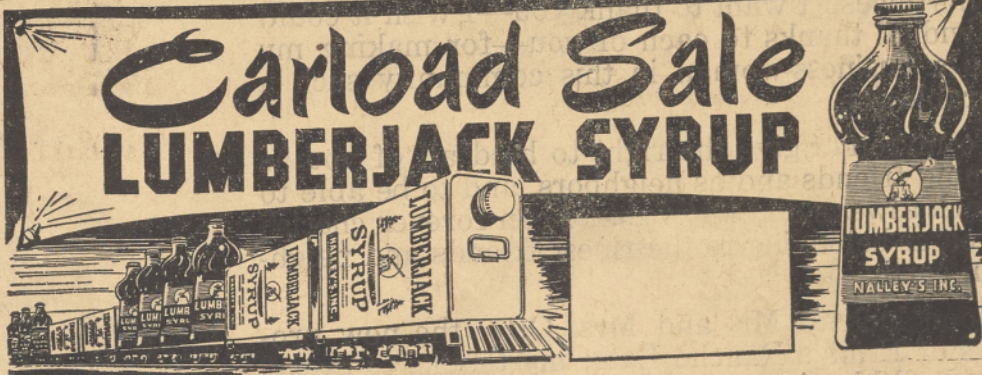
