Get Info For
Nov. 7 Polls

The second meeting of the newly organized local unit of the League of Women Voters of Clackamas county will be held Wednesday, October 18 at 7 p. m. in the Wemme Community hall, Wemme. Unit members plan to alternate monthly meetings between Sandy and The Mountain area until growing membership warrants the forming of two local units.

All interested women, from Sandy to Government Camp, are invited to attend the meetings, according to unit leader Mrs. Fred Ferguson, Brightwood. The initial meeting was held in September at the home of Mrs. George Hartwig, Sandy. Discussion chairmen were named at that meeting.

The October 18 program, under the leadership of Mrs. Pat Rogan, Brightwood, will be a briefing and discussion of the nine measures to be voted upon in the November 7 elections.

Among the measures are the so-called "Children's Bill," a proposal to levy an annual state tax outside the six percent limitation, providing an additional \$30 per capita for the educational needs of school children; a needy aged persons public assistance act; a prohibition of promulgative advertised alcoholic beverages and a constitutional amendment for legislative representation reapportionment.

Pros and cons of the measures will be presented to the women and a discussion of the bills will follow. Since the League is strictly a non-party organization, no endorsement of any bill will be made.

County and state candidates for office, up for election on November 7, will be seen and heard at a public meeting, sponsored by the county league on Thursday, October 12, at 8 p. m. in the Milwaukee city hall. This will be the only time for most county residents to get a close view of the men they may vote into office.

Seven women from the area now make up the local unit and at least an additional 13 are needed for two units.

The Wemme Community hall, scene of the October 18 League meet, is located on the Mt. Hood Loop highway at Wemme, next door to the Wemme United States Post Office.

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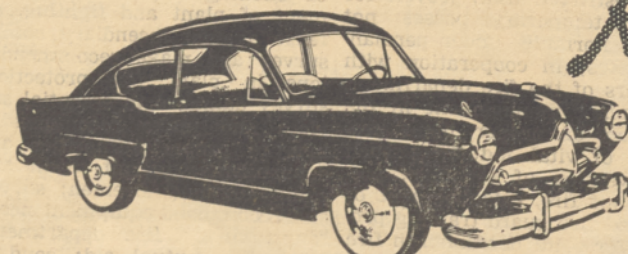
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
