The next meeting of the club will be held Wednesday, November 22, at the Canton Grill, Portland.

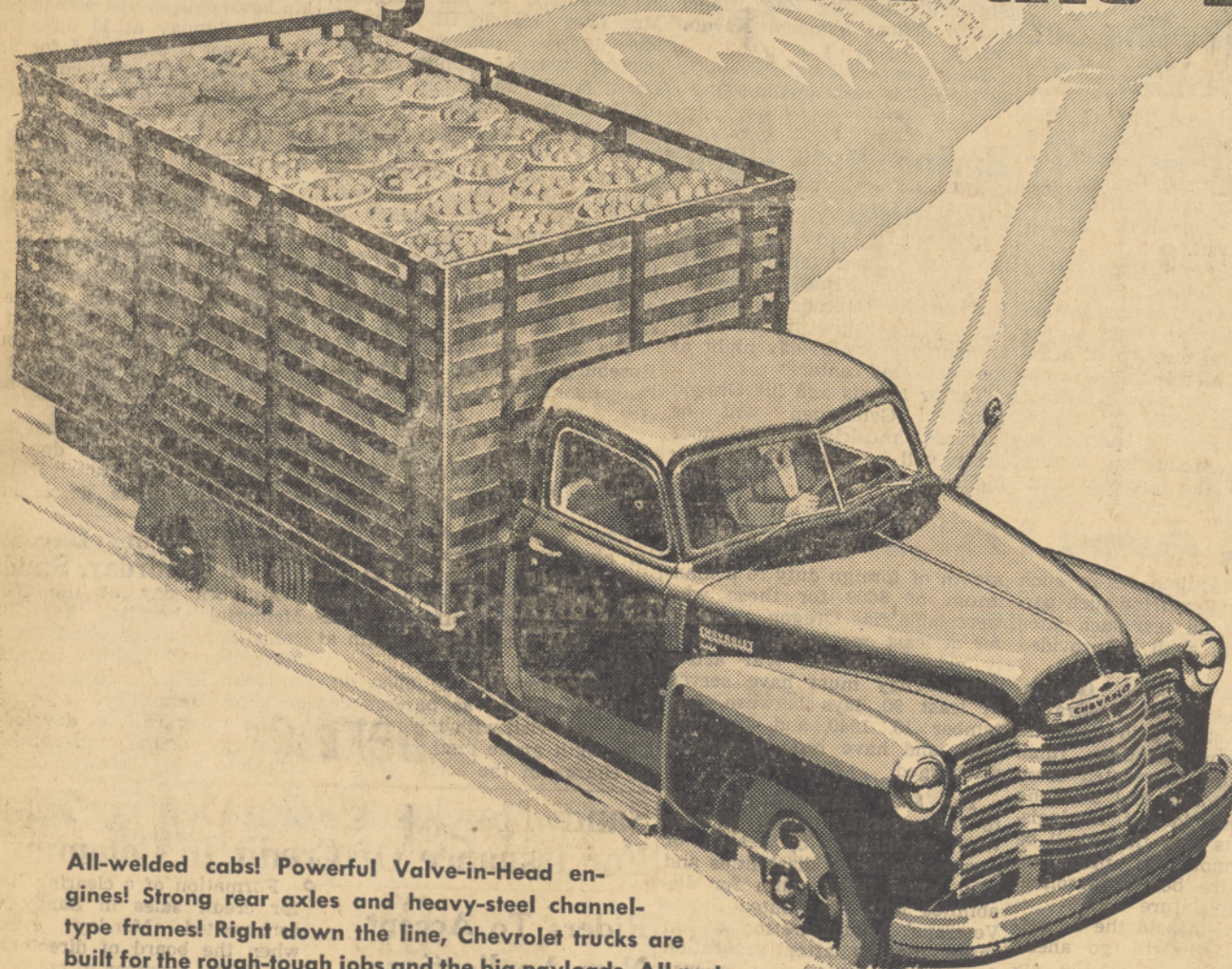
