### Oregon Webfoots Continue Hoop Action On Road

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, (Special) — Oregon's basketball Ducks wind up a session with final examinations this week and resume non-conference action with a pair of games against the strong Wyoming Cowboys at Laramie. The 15-man travelling party will make the trip by train.

Coach John Warren said today that he felt the next six games would do much to determine the strength of the Webfoots for the 1951 conference race. "After playing Wyoming, College of Puget Sound and Santa Clara six games in nine days we should know pretty much what we can do in tough competition. We will have to be ready for that series in Seattle on January 5 and 6 against Washington if we hope to make a race of it when the conference schedule opens," Warren stated.

The bench strength of the Ducks is expected to get a stiff test in the half-dozen encounters. The starting lineup of Will

Urban and Curt Barclay at forwards, Jim Loscutoff at center and Ken Hunt and Jack Keller at guards can't be expected to go through without considerable help from the reserves.

Jim Vranizan, Mel Streeter and Keith Farnam are tabbed for action at forward, with Chet Noe and Henry Bonnemman at center and Art Shepherd and Mel Krause at guard. These 12 men are leading in the fight for spots on the travel squad and unless John Neeley or Hal Webb breaks in later should constitute the Duck personnel for the trips to Laramie and Tacoma.

The fine play of Loscutoff, Noe, Farnam, Shepherd and Barclay among the newcomers and the steady work of the veterans, Urban, Krause, Hunt, Keller, Streeter and Vranizan has highlighted the workouts which followed the UCLA series.

Warren is particularly pleased with the backboard work of his "big" men at both forward and center. In the first five games the Ducks have out-rebounded their opposition almost two to one. A weakness in shooting, both from the field and the free throw line, has hampered the Oregon in several games.

### Specialist Gives Tips For Cooking Christmas Turkey

Once again it's time for Miss Agnes Kolshorn, O.S.C. nutrition specialist, to "talk turkey" to Oregon homemakers. Here are her suggestions for preparing the holiday bird for the dinner table.

To cook a whole turkey evenly, start it on one side of the breast, turn it to the other side, and then to the back. Turn a small or medium sized bird about every hour, a large bird every hour and a half. Usually no basting is necessary during the first hour and a half of roasting.

Cooking slowly at low temperatures in an open pan means less shrinkage, less loss of juices from the meat, and better flavor and appearance. Miss Kolshorn recommends an oven temperature of 325 degrees F., or moderately low, for the average-size turkey, and 300 degrees F., a low temperature, for larger birds.

An 8 to 10 pound bird will need about 3 to 3½ hours, a 10 to 14 pound bird 3½ to 4 hours, and a 14 to 18 pound bird, 4½ to 5 hours. The turkey is done when the joints can be moved easily.

If a frozen ready-to-cook turkey is used, thawing before cooking saves oven time. If they are not thawed first, allow one and a half times as long as usual to cook.

There's no better place than the refrigerator for thawing a whole bird, Miss Kolshorn adds. Take off wrappings and cover the turkey loosely with waxed paper. By this method, a large whole bird will take about 2 days to thaw. A small bird, or a half, quarter, or a half breast, will take at least overnight. "Cut-ups"—legs, thighs, drumsticks or wings—need from 3 to 9 hours thawing time.

Sometimes it's convenient to combine room temperature with refrigerator thawing. Allow a large turkey, for instance, to stand in the kitchen (at around 70 degrees) for a day. Then put it in the refrigerator or other cold place overnight, and roast the next day.
