Robert Tacheron, Roy Ledbury Among Oregon State Grads

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—Robert George Tacheron of Eagle Creek, senior in science, and Roy Arthur Ledbury of Boring, senior in agriculture, are among the 1465 seniors and graduate students to receive degrees at the 82nd annual commencement exercises at Oregon State college June 4.

A record-breaking number of 218 advanced degrees will be conferred by President A. L. Strand. Of this number, 22 are doctors of philosophy and seven doctors of education—another new record in the number of doctor's degrees conferred in one year.

A total of 1247 bachelors of science and bachelors of arts degrees, representing four full years of study, will also be conferred. In addition to the doctorates, advanced degrees will include 135 masters of science, 12 masters of arts, 33 masters of education, three masters of home economics, two masters of forestry and four professional engineering degrees.

Dr. Leonard Odiorne, pastor of the Westminster Presbyterian church, Portland, will deliver the baccalaureate sermon Sunday morning, June 3. Alumni will return for class reunions all day Saturday.
