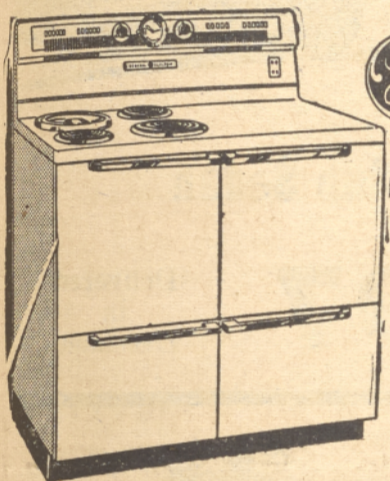

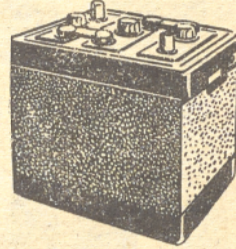
Degrees Awarded To Students From Sandy

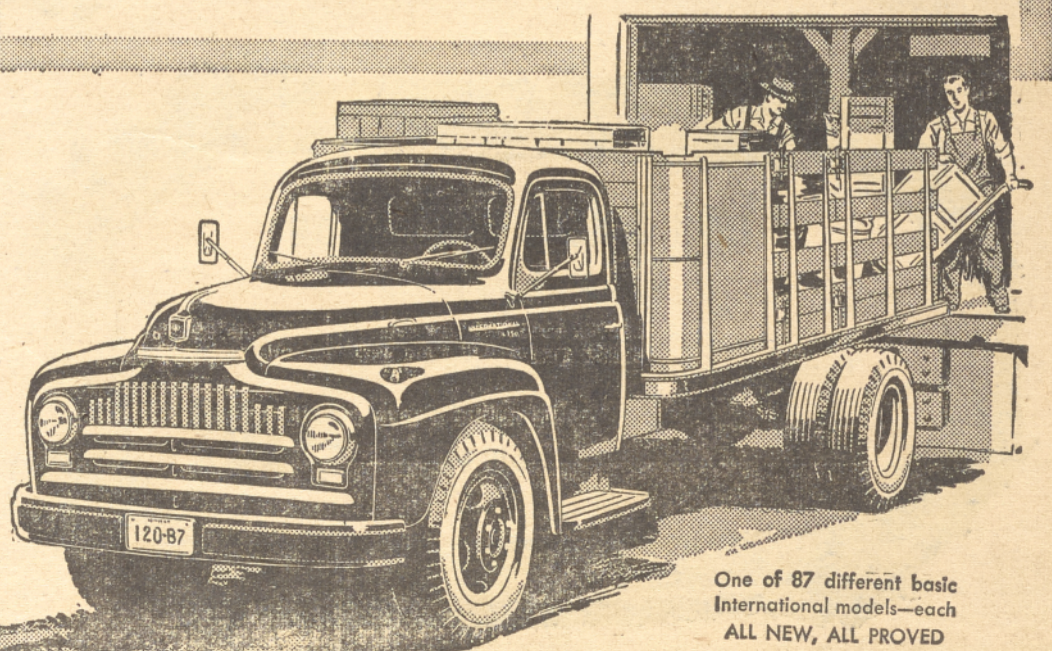
