FAITH

The word "faith" is used in two different ways in the New Testament. One is to mean sincere belief in something or someone. The other is to mean the whole system of Faith or Christianity. The latter usually has the article "the" used with it, thus, "the faith." Examples of this are Paul's language in II Timothy 4:7, "... I have kept the faith;" and Paul again in Ephesians 4:5, There is "one Lord, one Faith, one Baptism."

Paul meant in the first that he had kept the whole system of faith and in the second he expressed the singleness of the system. So there is only ONE Faith, as Christ said there was only ONE Way when he said, "I am THE WAY." If there is only one faith, and Paul said there was, there cannot be your faith or my faith unless they be the same faith. If they are not alike, then one of our faiths must of a necessity be wrong. Of course there is an individual faith on the part of each individual person, but that sincere belief must be the same in each heart to the extent of having believed in the same thing, and believe the same about the same thing. I Corinthians 1:10; "Now I beseech you brethren through the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that ye be perfected together in the same mind and in the same judgment." May we as people of God today in this 1952 do our very best to do just that, be of the same mind and judgment.
