Marian Anderson To Sing Monday Night

A capacity audience is expected at the auditorium Monday night, February 11, when Marian Anderson, world-famous contralto, sings for the first time with the Portland Symphony orchestra.

Conductor James Sample has programmed an evening of wide variety and musical appeal for this last special concert outside the regular subscription series.

Accompanied by the orchestra, Miss Anderson will sing Mahler's "Kindertotenlieder." She will be heard again in Brahms "Alto Rhapsody" with the male chorus of the Portland Symphonic Choir, Robert Zimmerman, director. She will also sing an aria from Donizetti's "La Favorita."

One of the great singers of our time, Miss Anderson has sung in Portland on many occasions, always to capacity houses. She considers every concert appearance "another debut" and is constantly searching for perfection.

An orchestral feature will be Dent Mowrey's "The Gargoyles of Notre Dame" which had its world premiere under Willem van Hoogstraten and the Portland Symphony orchestra.

Other numbers will be the Toccata and Fugue in D minor by Bach-Caillet and "Eine Kleine Nachtmusik, K. 525" by Mozart. Tickets may be purchased at the J. K. Gill box-office or by mail-order from the Portland Symphony Society, Park building.

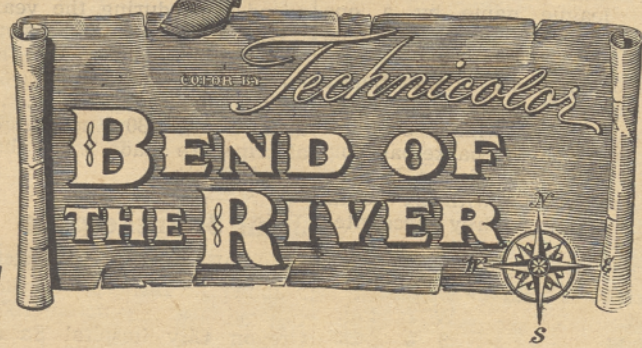
