**Casablanca, Africa
Scene Of Employment
For Avonne Markwart**

Avonne Markwart, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Markwart, Sandy, arrived in Casablanca, French Morocco, Africa about three weeks ago. She has been in civil service work for several years. Before going to Casablanca she worked at the Pentagon in Washington, D. C. and prior to Washington, Avonne was in Trieste. In a letter to her parents Miss Markwart says, "The people here are very fascinating and their dress is unusual. Some wear Biblical type clothing; some hooded garments; and others are in European attire. Fez caps and skull caps are worn by the men and the women are heavily veiled." She says, "Living is wonderful at Casablanca, a typical French city, with a modern sector, and some Arab sectors such as Medinas. Most people think of Africa as all hot and dry but in Casablanca the mornings are very cold and the climate in general is damp." "There are many wives and children of servicemen here and about a dozen civil service workers, like myself."

Who Is A Christian?

In pursuit, a Christian is a follower of Christ. He is one who has obeyed the commandments of Jesus Christ to have his sins remitted or forgiven. Jesus said, "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved. Peter said, "Repent and be baptized for the remission of your sins." Then Jesus said, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." In knowledge, a Christian is a disciple or learner of Christ. "Study to show thyself approved unto God a workman that needeth not to be ashamed . . ." 2 Tim. 2:15. In faith a Christian is a believer. "Be thou an ensample to them that believe, in word, in manner of life, in love, in faith, in purity." 1 Tim. 4:12. In character, a Christian is a Saint. A Christian cannot be declared a saint by man, but is a saint when he is following Christ. Paul called the Christians at Corinth, saints. A saint is one who has been sanctified. "Christ also loved the Church, and gave himself up for it; that he might sanctify it, having cleansed it by the washing of water with the word . . ." Eph. 5:25. In connection and relationship, a Christian, a Christian is a new creature. "Wherefore, if any man is in Christ, he is a new creature, . . ." 2 Cor. 5:17. "For as many of you as have been baptized into Christ, have put on Christ." Gal. 3:27. In illumination, a Christian is a light, Matthew 5:14. In influence, he is leaven, Matthew 13:33. In labor, a sower, and in combat a soldier; in alertness a watchman.
