"Significance"

There are some things significant about the Church of Christ. These things are characteristics identifying, and setting forth the Church of Christ for what it is.

First, it wears the name of its head, Jesus Christ, because it belongs to him; he bought it with his own blood. Acts 20:28. It wears this name and no other, because "there is salvation in none other . . . Acts 4:12." Second, the origin of the Church of Christ is significant. It originated on the first Pentecost after the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. It was originated with the coming of the Holy Spirit on this notable day. It was not established during the days of John the Baptist, for if so it would have been instituted without the blood of Christ for he had not yet died. It also would have been without the Holy Spirit who did not come until Pentecost. See John 16:13; Luke 24:49; Acts 1:8; 2:1. Third, the membership in which is essentially to be saved, for it is his body. Eph. 1:22, for "all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ." All spiritual blessings would include the forgiveness of sins. By baptism we put on Christ. Gal. 3:27. Fourth, it uses the only kind of music found authorized or used in the New Testament. Its members sing and make melody in their hearts unto the Lord. Eph. 5:19. They "teach and admonish one another with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs; singing with grace in their hearts unto God." Col. 3:17.

Fifth, the Church of Christ tries to speak where the Bible speaks and be silent where the Bible is silent, and pleads with all men to unite upon the pages of the New Testament; to lay aside the precepts and doctrines of men. "For my ways are above your ways, and my thoughts above your thoughts, saith Jehovah."
