The Origin and History of EASTER

The word "Easter" is the anglicized form of the name of a Teutonic goddess, who was called "Eostre," or "Ostern" (the word "east" is from the same derivative), who was the goddess of spring, and the dawn. Due to the fact that the Saxon tribes held a feast to this goddess at the same time of the Catholics' feast, the Catholic missionaries borrowed the pagan term and applied it to their holiday. Little does it seem to bother some that the worship of this goddess can be traced back to a time when human sacrifices were offered to her, when handsome young men were murdered and presented in burnt offerings as an appeasement of her wrath. In comparing some of the obscene practices that were carried on in the worship of this goddess, many authorities think that this was the same goddess that Jezebel introduced among the Israelites. She is known in the Old Testament as: "Ash-toreth," "Astarte" (Greek), "Queen of Heaven," or "Asherah" (Phoenician). The Catholics have borrowed the third term, applying it to Mary, the mother of Jesus.

There is nothing in the Bible that in any way would give a man an excuse for using the name of a pagan goddess in speaking of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. The uninformed will argue that the word "Easter" is found in the Bible. It is found only in the King James Version and possibly one other. All the other translations, translated the word from the original Greek to be "passover." Even then, in the King James the very same Greek word was translated in EVERY PLACE except the one, Acts 12:14; "passover." Archbishop Trench (Episcopalian) says that this word which had designated first a heathen festival "was not happily used to set forth a Jewish feast!"

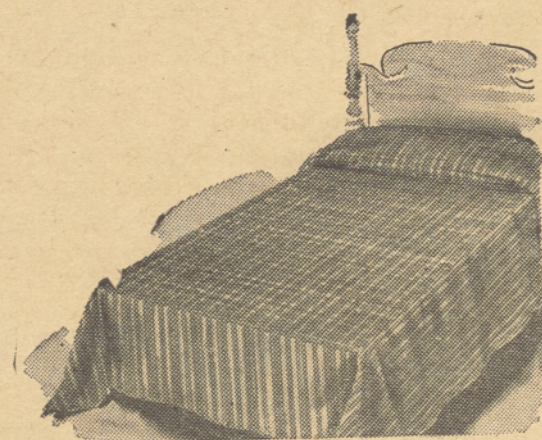
