"In experiments at Corvallis from 1929 to 1935 comparisons were made of the yields and returns from irrigated and non-irrigated fields of berries . . . The irrigated berries were from 25 to 100 per cent larger in size than the non-irrigated, and an average gain in yield of 91.5 per cent was obtained.

"When soil moisture is deficient, irrigation during harvest prolongs the season and increases the size of the fruit. Irrigation in the dry season of the summer months stimulates growth so that the plants are in better condition to produce the following year . . .
