Applesauce Cake; Recipe of the Week

The following recipe was submitted by Mrs. Ivan Barker, as the Sandy Posts' recipe of the week.

Aggie's Applesauce Cake
Cream together $\frac{1}{2}$ c shortening and 1c sugar. Add 1 egg, beaten and 1c unsweetened or sweetened applesauce. Mix and sift together the dry ingredients; 2c flour, 1t soda, $\frac{1}{2}$ t baking powder, 1t cinnamon, 1t nutmeg, and $\frac{1}{2}$ t salt. Add dry ingredients to batter, then stir in 1t vanilla and 1c raisins.

Combine thoroughly, then pour into a well-greased and floured loaf pan or layer pan. Bake in a moderate oven, 350 degrees F, for 30 minutes or less in layer pan, about an hour in loaf pans, depending on size of pan.

If desired, $\frac{1}{2}$ t cloves may be added.

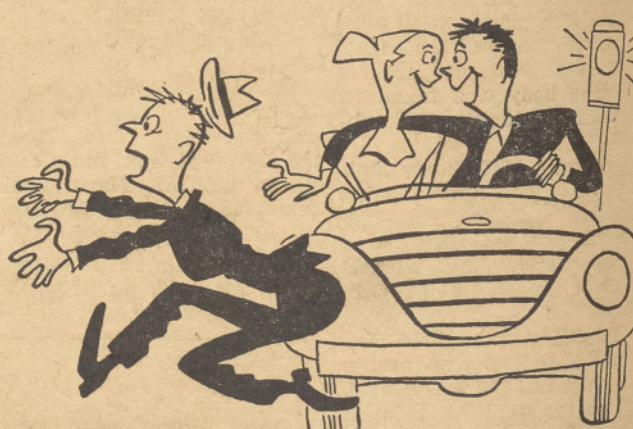
