Sermon: "Spiritual Values Which We May Derive From A Period Of Rest." Are you weary, and your loads seem too heavy to bear? Hear this sermon, you may find help.

Clarifying The "Spiritual Gifts"

Only the theories of men have mixed and muddled the subject of Spiritual Gifts, and only the Word of God can clarify and classify those Gifts. There are THREE and only three forms of Spiritual Gifts revealed to men in the New Testament. We will cite and study them in order, but space will only permit the study of one at a time. The others will follow in the next coming weeks. Now the first we will cite and study: 1. THE COMMON GIFT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT—By the common gift I mean the gift common to all who obey the Gospel. This gift is mentioned in Acts 5:32; "And we are witnesses of these things; and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God hath given to them that obey him." It is also mentioned in Gal. 4:6; "And because ye are sons, God sent forth the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, Abba, Father." (See also Gal. 3:26,27; and 4:6.)

Peter said in Acts 2:38,39; "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus unto the remission of your sins and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." The scripture explicitly states that all believers who would repent and be baptized "unto the remission of sins" should "receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." That would make this gift of the Holy Spirit common or universal to all who obey the Gospel of Christ. This gift, common to all who become sons of God at baptism, is never attended by miraculous power, but is the natural effect of entering into the fellowship with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Read Matt. 28:18-20.
