III. HOLY SPIRIT BAPTISM

The New Testament gives but two cases of the Holy Spirit baptism being received by men. One of these was when the Apostles received that Gift on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:1-5) and the other was when it was bestowed upon Cornelius and his household (Acts 10:44-48). Each is called a "baptism." (Acts 1:5; Acts 11:16,17). No other case is recorded in the New Testament. The Baptism on the day of Pentecost resulted in giving to the Apostles the INSPIRATION which made them infallible teachers. That inspiration was not for them individually, but for the rest of the world who should read their writings or hear their word, as on the day of Pentecost. The Apostles therefore became the MEDIUM through which we might have the pure and infallible Word of God to guide us. Their "speaking in tongues" was to enable ALL NATIONS to hear and understand the Word of God, since, through that Gift, they could speak in every "tongue" or language spoken by men of any nation.

Likewise the Gift bestowed upon Cornelius, was not for HIM personally, but that the Jews present, including Peter, might know that God had authorized the Gospel preached to the Gentiles—and their baptism into Christ unto the remission of sins, exactly like the Jews beginning on the day of Pentecost. Hence, as soon as Peter saw the Gift poured out upon Cornelius, he demanded of the Jews present: "Can any man forbid the water, that these should not be baptized, who have received the Holy Spirit as well as we?" That states the PURPOSE of the Gift to Cornelius: It was to convince the Jews that the Gentiles were to be baptized into Christ exactly as the Jews had been.

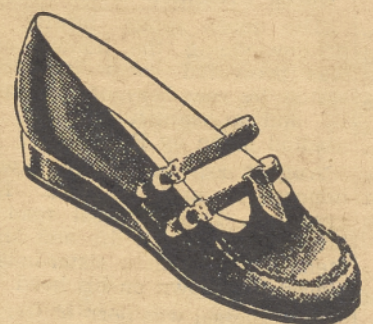
