The bride is the daughter of Mrs. Edith Gillam and the groom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Johnson.

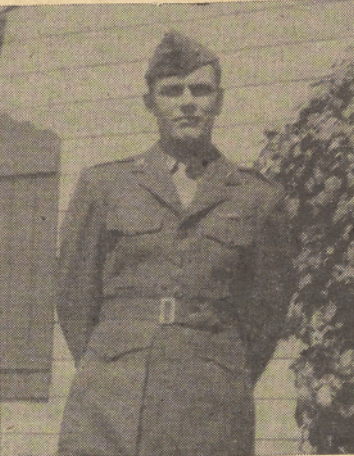
Vacation Trip Takes Family Into Canada

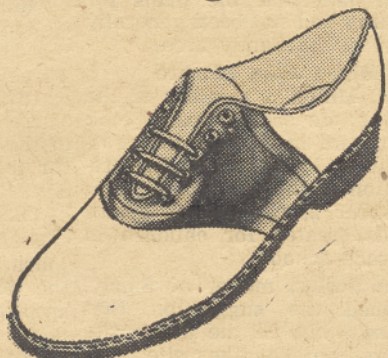
