Dear Friends,

As an automobile dealer it is somewhat difficult for me to write here what I feel—difficult because in doing so I am pointing to the biggest failing of the automobile industry. On the other hand, it is my closeness to the industry which makes me feel perhaps somewhat more strongly than most of you about my subject.

Throughout my first 3 years as Dodge-Plymouth dealer in Gresham I have watched with increasing anxiety the growing accident toll in our area. There's no question about it—the automobile here in eastern Multnomah County is frighteningly, stupidly and sickeningly a killer.

Most of the time we don't know the people who have been killed in an automobile accident, but sometimes we do. Sometimes it's an elderly woman, sometimes a young man, and sometimes—particularly during the 9 school months starting soon—it's a child. Whoever it is, it doesn't feel good when we find out about it—but when we hear of the death of a grade school child, we know 2 things: 1. An innocent youngster somehow can never be blamed for an automobile accident. 2. A father and a mother have lost something which is irreplaceable.

What does all this mean to you and me? It means that we must give the gravest possible cooperation to those officials who are on duty to protect human life. It means paying close attention to laws and signals . . . driving at a safe speed always . . . and giving your fellow man the proper signals and courtesy. It means that when you see a sign "school zone" you are always to proceed with extreme caution.

It means that we must outlaw traffic tragedies from our community. It means that each one of us must accept the responsibilities for making our streets the safest in the world, not only for school children—but for all pedestrians and motorists.

I sincerely hope that you and I won't just say these things. You and I must mean what we say and do what is right for the safety of our community.
