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(This is one of a series of messages sponsored by the Sandy Oil Company. The following is an excerpt from an interview with Civil Defense Administrator Millard F. Caldwell, Jr.)

Q. You haven't been able to convince Congress, have you?

A. No, but the Congress is understandably, and perhaps properly, behind the people. We've made far greater progress with the people than we have with government, whether the government be national, state, or local.

One great difficulty with Congress is that, first, it does not know a great deal about the need for civil defense and what it includes. They've been too busy to find out. Secondly, Congress has taken isolated statements made by responsible people and has come up with the belief that air power, for instance, is the only insurance or that the power to retaliate would be so great that it would be unlikely that we'd be hit. One member of Congress even went so far as to suggest that Russia did not possess the bomb. Maybe in view of the announcement that Russia has exploded a second bomb, he will be convinced now.

So, we've had a good many difficulties there, but I believe that Congress is learning for the first time in history that the character of warfare is changed. In the past, wars have been won or lost by the armies in the field, and now they are going to be won or lost by the people on the home front.

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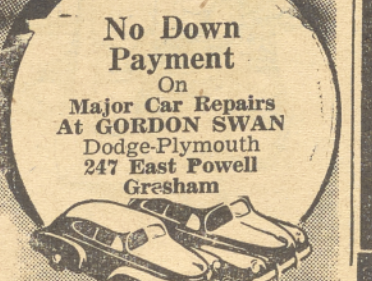
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
