Mr. and Mrs. Cook donated the use of the grounds, pool and showers during these classes.

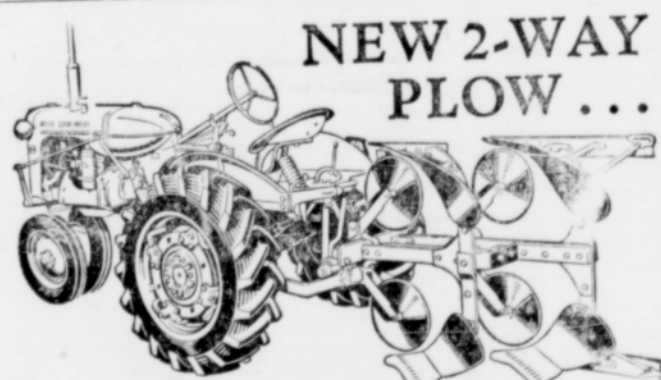
