Since then, she has completed her second tour of duty in the Far East. Skippered by Cmdr. R. B. Carlson of Minot, N. D., the Besugo has a crew of eight officers and 72 enlisted men.

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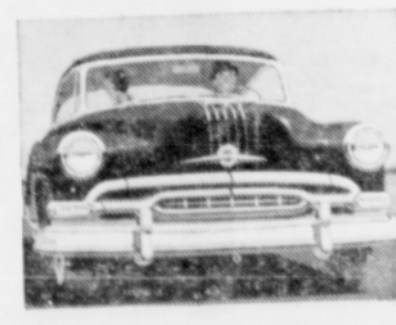
