Membership Tea Slated at McLoughlin House July 29

All Sandy and Mountain area residents are invited to the McLoughlin House membership tea to be held on the grounds at McLoughlin House in Oregon City next Thursday afternoon, July 29 from 3 to 5 o'clock. The purpose of the tea is to arouse interest and increase the financial security of the national historic site.

Admission tickets will make the holder a member of the McLoughlin Memorial Association for one year and will admit the holder to the McLoughlin House as many times in that year as he wishes to go through the house (without paying the regular fee). Tickets may be purchased at the door. Garden clubs will decorate tea tables.

Only County Shrine

McLoughlin House, the only Clackamas county national monument under the National Park Service of the Department of Interior, is located at 7th and Center streets in Oregon City. It is sponsored by the National Park Service, the McLoughlin Memorial Association and the Municipality of Oregon City. The federal government provides no funds for maintenance of the shrine. Memberships and regular admission fees paid by non-members are the only source of income.

Approximately 10,000 persons from all 48 states and from many foreign lands visit and enjoy Mc-

Loughlin House annually. Over 4,000 school children from all over the state visit the historic monument each year.

Pioneer Dwelling

The house is one of the few remaining pioneer dwellings in the region once known as the Oregon Country which today consists of the states of Oregon, Washington, Idaho and parts of Montana and Wyoming. It was built in 1845-46 by Dr. John McLoughlin, chief factor and superintendent of the Columbia department of the Hudson's Bay Company.

To the Oregonian this house represents the romantic epoch of the State's history when the transition from the fur-trading era to that of settlement was being effected.

The Shrine is open daily, except Monday, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. during the summer months and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. during the winter. Adjacent to the McLoughlin House is the Barclay House, also a historic building, where meals are served.
