Alma Fields Announced as Dramatic Director for "Samson and Delilah"

Alma Francis Fields, well known Sandy and Portland voice teacher, is the dramatic stage director for the Portland Civic Opera Association's production of Saint-Saens' "Samson and Delilah."

The first of four performances of the opera will be given to-morrow evening at 7 p.m. in Portland's Washington Park garden amphitheater.

The opera is the opening and feature attraction of the 5th annual summer music festival sponsored by the Portland park bureau in cooperation with the musicians' union. Night performances at 7 p.m. are scheduled for Aug. 6 and 7 and twilight performances starting at 5 p.m. for Aug. 8 and 14. Admission is free.

Taking part in the spectacular production, one of the most ambitious summer projects ever attempted by the association, will be nearly 300 singers, dancers and musicians.

Title roles will be sung by Elizabeth Pharris and Fern Miser as Delilah and John Hinderlie as Samson. Other leads are Elliot Savage as the high priest; Harold Gillette and John Philis as the first and second Philistines; and Jolly Ditzler as the Philistine messenger. Charles Trombley and Dean Scott will be heard in the role of Abimelech; Dean Scott and Robert Leppert as the old Hebrew.

Ariel Rubinstein is conductor and musical director. Bruce Marvin and Charles Osburn are the chorus directors. Choreographer and ballet director is Dorothea Lensch.

"Samson and Delilah" is the first of four attractions to be presented by the opera association during the 1954-55 season. The other three will be staged in the civic auditorium. They include "Don Giovanni" Sept. 24, "The Barber of Seville" Nov. 26, and "Tosca" April 30, 1955.

Other events scheduled during the two-week long festival include square dancing Aug. 9; the dance pageant, "Wizard of Oz", Aug. 12 and 13; Japanese festival dances, Aug. 15 and 17; musical circus, Aug. 15 and 17; Sweet Adeline Night, Aug. 18; Star time, show time, Aug. 19 and 20; and an international folk dance festival and exhibition, Aug. 21.

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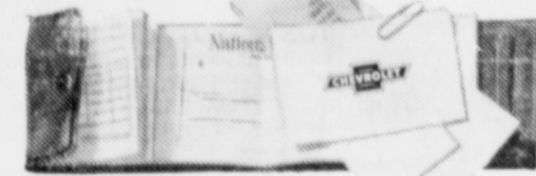
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
