Neals Home After Summer In Dakotas

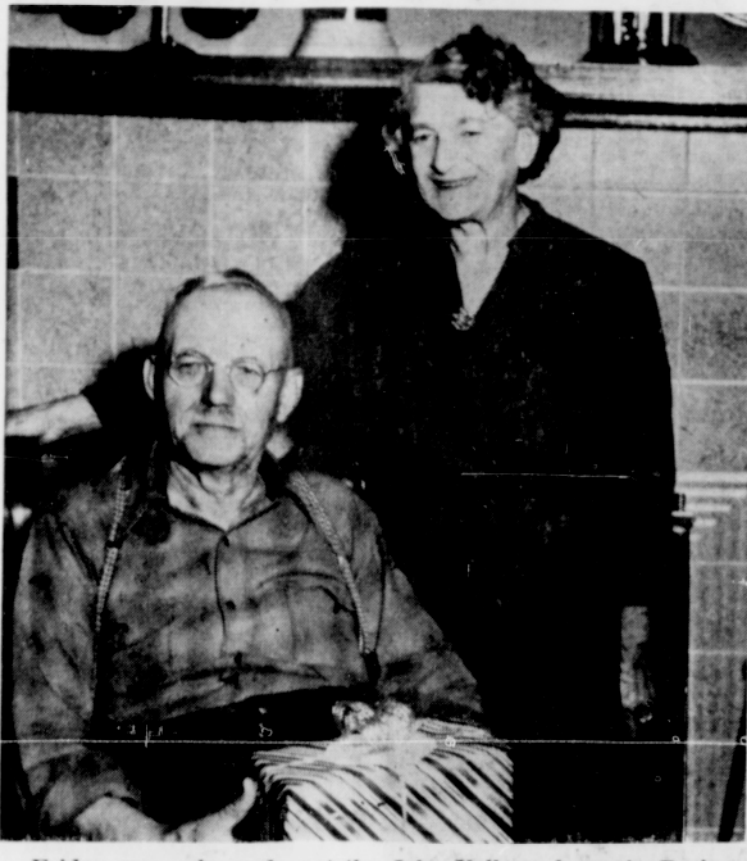
