ABOUT THE FARM

By John J. Inskeep, County Agent Legally moving cattle and horses on Oregon highways requires a transportation certificate. This certificate shows the point of origination of animals being shipped, their description and brand marks, if any, and the number of head. In fact a description of each animal is expected.

Truck shipments are subject to rigid inspection by state police and other peace officers. Purchased animals must be accompanied by a bill of sale. The idea of this law is to prevent theft. Shipments of animals which slip through to stockyards without transportation slips are held by state inspectors until

legal ownership is definitely proven. We carry a supply of these slips in the Extension office, Oregon City, at cost as one of many extra services.

How would you dispose of a domestic animal which had strayed or otherwise mysteriously appeared on your farm? Would you keep it after advertising, sell it, or what would you do?

Here is what the law says, and it is a new law. This is rather heavy reading but important information. We hesitate to summarize for fear of omitting some essential detail.

New Law

"Taking up and selling estrays: Interfering with animals. 607.301 Definitions. As used in ORS 607.301 to 607.341:

(1) "Estray" means any bovine animal, horse or mule of any known owner unlawfully running at large trespassing within a legal enclosure.

(2) "Department" means State Department of Agriculture of the state of Oregon. (1953 c. 367:1)

607.306 Taking up estrays by owner or lessee of property. Estray may be taken up by the owner or lessee of any property. However, no estray, unless unlawfully at large, shall be taken up in the months of April, May, June, July, Aug. Sep., Oct., or Nov. (1953 c. 267:2)

607.311 Taking up estray prohibited without giving notice. No person shall knowingly take up or retain possession, custody or control of an estray without giving notice required by ORS 607.316. (1953 c. 367:8)

607.316 Notice to department of taking up estray. A person taking up an estray shall notify the department of such act in writing within five days of the taking. The notice shall be sent to the department at its Salem office.

607.321 Investigation by department upon receipt of notice. (1) The department, when it receives a notice of taking, shall undertake to determine the animal's true owner from the recorded brand, marks and other identifying characteristics and other relevant information tending to establish ownership.

(2) A record of such information, together with the findings of the department supporting its determination of ownership, shall be made and preserved for three years. (1953 c. 367:4)

607.326 Sale of estray if owner not found: Notice of sale. (1) If the department does not determine who is the true owner of the estray, it shall, not sooner than 30 days nor more than 45 days after receiving the notice of taking, cause the estray to be sold at public sale.

(2) The department shall cause a notice of taking up to be published in a newspaper of general circulation through the area in which the estray was taken up, once a week for two successive weeks or two publications in all prior to the sale. The notice shall state, among other things, that the estray will be sold at a stated time and place if not claimed by the true owner prior to the date of sale. (1953 c. 367:5)

607.331 Claim by owner prior to sale; disposition of proceeds of sale.

(1) If the true owner of an estray appears and makes claim to sale, he must as a condition of regaining custody of such estray, pay all of the costs mentioned in subsection (2) of this section which may have accrued. If the true owner fails to pay or tender payment of such costs in lawful money of the United States, the sale shall be carried out as in cases where the owner is unknown.

(2) All costs relating to the taking up and sale of an estray shall be paid from the proceeds of the sale, the costs to be paid in the following priority:

ELECTRIC BILL 20% SURCHARGE ISSUE IN PRESENT CAMPAIGN

Monroe Sweetland, who led the fight against the power monopoly during and after the 1953 Legislative session, is meeting stiff resistance in his state senate campaign this year from behind-the-scenes efforts of the power companies to defeat him. As State Representative from Clackamas County in the 1953 session, it was Sweetland who succeeded in passing his bill to make it impossible in the future for power companies to again put over an extra charge on consumer's power bills without even a hearing.

More than \$4,600,000 was collected by the power companies from Oregon families through the unjust 'surcharge'. It was Representative and Mrs. Sweetland who fought the battle through 24 days of hearings at Salem in the summer of 1953. The case is now on appeal to the Oregon supreme court.

Mr. Sweetland is a nominee on the Democratic ticket, but many registered Republicans are also giving one of their two state senate votes to him so that Clackamas County has a State Senator who will not be influenced or intimidated by the powerful lobby of the power trust at Salem.
