### Boring Resident Sees Varied Points of Interest on Trip

Editor's note: At the request of numerous friends of Dock Hunt, he wrote us a few highlights of his summer's trip to Tennessee and other states.

My two daughters, Dixie and Mrs. Carroll Jackson and I left Boring on July 8 on a 2,833 mile trip to Kingsport, Tenn. Kingsport is in the northeastern part of Tennessee.

The weather was terribly hot and disagreeable, as high as 119 in Nebraska most of the time. Highways were reasonably good all the way.

We noted with interest that the Eastman Kodak Co. in Kingsport employs 4,800 people and thought what a plant like that would mean to Clackamas county. The Tennessee Eastman is one of the largest industries in Tennessee.

It produces cellulose fibres and plastics on a large scale; also seriate and die stuffs, and supplies large amounts of raw organic chemical materials. During the war, the Eastman operated the Oakridge atomic plant in addition to operating the Holston ordnance plant, which in itself employed 15,000 people.

The Eastman Kodak plant covers an area of 372 acres, consisting of something over 160 buildings.

Another point of interest which we visited was Cudjoe's Cave at Cumberland Gap (Tenn., Vir., and Ky.) About 21 miles of this cave has been explored. It houses the world's largest stalagmite, estimated to be 85 million years old. It is 65 feet high and 35 feet in circumference.

We also visited the natural tunnel in Virginia, The Great Smokey Mountain National Park and the Cherokee Indian Reservation. The latter, I think, is one of the most colorful sights I have ever seen.

The Andrew Jackson Hermitage, near Nashville, Tenn., was visited. This is located on a 720 acre tract of land and is being

maintained by the Ladies Hermitage Association. The house has all the original furniture and interior. Truly an antique collector's dream.

It was interesting to note the progress made in the Tennessee Valley since the establishment of the TVA.

The main reason for my trip was to see my mother, my brothers and sister. We spent our time at my mother's home, making the trips from there. This was the third trip back since coming to Oregon in 1926. Our travels took us through Tennessee, Virginia, N. Carolina and Kentucky.

On this trip I gathered a number of curios and antiques which were on display at Al Gantenbein's Kelso Store.
