of everybody concerned.

Dear Editor:

I am in receipt of a letter
from John Misko, a copy of
which, the face of the letter in-
dicates, was sent to you. Mr.
Misko by this letter, of course,
takes responsibility for the se-
ries of false and misleading ads
attacking my voting record,
which have appeared in several
newspapers in Clackamas county.
Howard Belton, the other Re-
publican nominee for State Sen-
ate named in these ads, stated
publicly at the Junior Chamber
of Commerce in Oregon City
last Friday that he had not been
a party to these ads; that he had
not approved them nor been con-
sulted in their preparation. He
has since written me personally.
Responsible Republicans, proud
of the good name and reputation
of their party, will resent this
attempt to link the respected in-
cumbent State Senator with this
desperate campaign tactic.

Mr. Belton also stated that he
had not received any funds from
Portland General Electric Com-
pany for his campaign. He was
aware, as are all the newspaper
editors in the county, that the
series of ads, for which Mr. Mis-
ko takes responsibility, were pre-
pared and distributed by Gerber
and Co., the advertising agency
for the Portland General Electric
Company.

Mr. Misko's apology is itself
misleading. It states that I was
absent and failed to vote on H.
B. 300. The record of the Legis-
lative session (p. 41, House Cal-
endar) will show, on the con-
trary, that I was present and
voted FOR the Soil Conservation
Bill.

On House Bill 26, where I am
accused of voting "against the
interest of the farmer," the re-
cord will show (p. 5, House Cal-
endar) that when the bill, as
originally introduced, providing
full indemnity for destroyed live-
stock, I voted FOR the measure.
When the bill was watered down
by amendment in the Senate to
provide only partial payment, I
voted against the measure. In
this I followed the lead of my
Republican colleague, Representa-
tive Rod McKenzie of Curry
county, and other spokesmen in
the House for the small live-
stock producer.

I will greatly appreciate it if
you will carry this letter in your
letters-to-the-editor column, as
well as Mr. Misko's acknowl-
edgment of responsibility for these
ads. The use of last minute hit-
and-run smear charges is not,
unfortunately, new in American
politics. I regret, however, that
the race for State Senate in
Clackamas county should have
been besmirched by this "regret-
table incident."

We have plenty of genuine dif-
ferences of opinion. Let's fight
this election on those differences
—not on false issues which don't
even exist.

Cheap Radiator Salts May Damage

With the first threats of scat-
tered frosts and freezing temper-
atures in the area, it's time to
think about anti-freeze solution
for the radiators of cars, farm
trucks and tractors. County ag-
ents warn that cheap anti-freeze
may not be a bargain at all.

Common anti-freeze solutions
for radiators have ethylene gly-
col or alcohols as a base. How-

ever, some salt solutions have
appeared on the market under
various trade names, and these
latter are highly unsatisfactory
and often plug radiators.

Glycol types will come canned
under a reliable brand name and
usually not in bulk, agents point-
ed out. The alcohol can be identi-
fied by odor or by placing a tea-
spoon of it on the ground and
lighting it with a match. It will
burn, while the salt solution will
not.

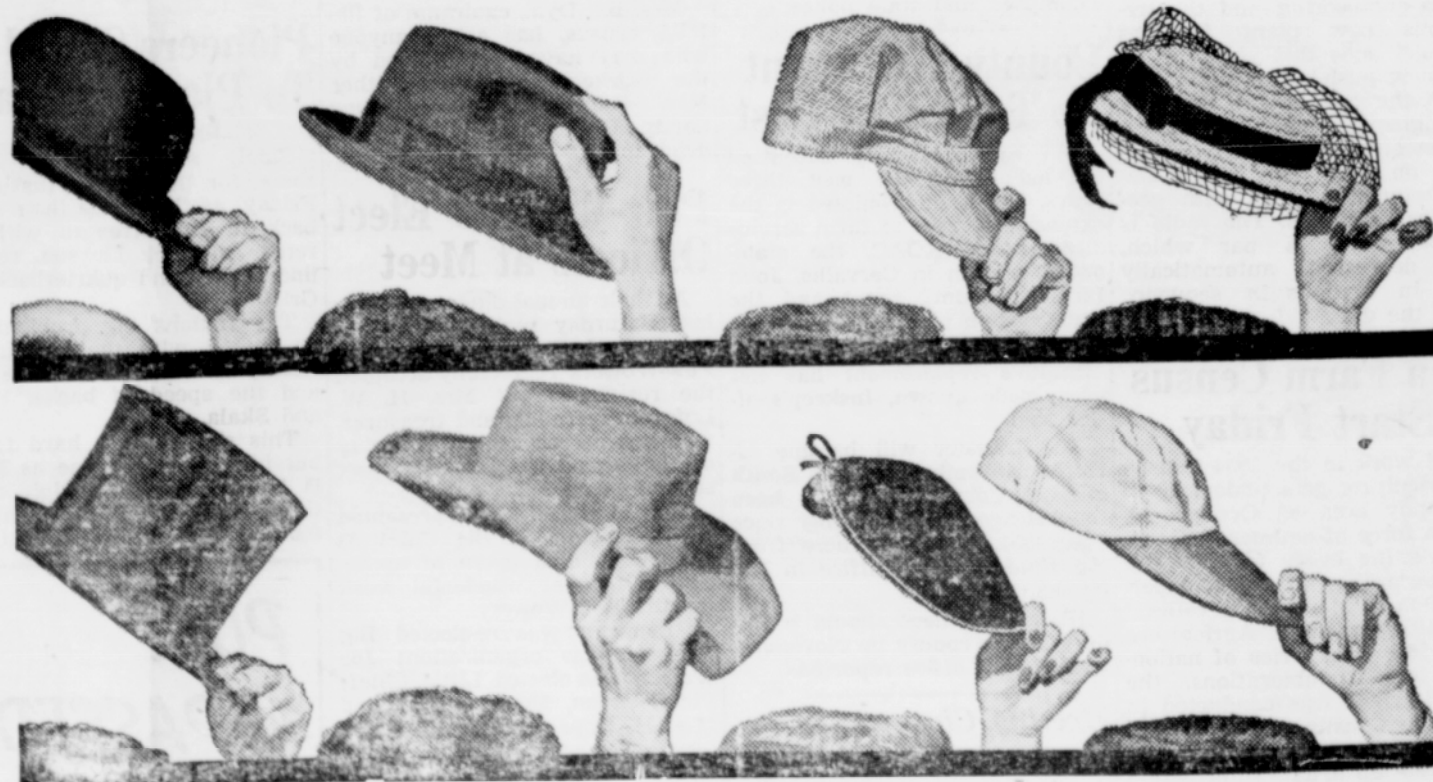
