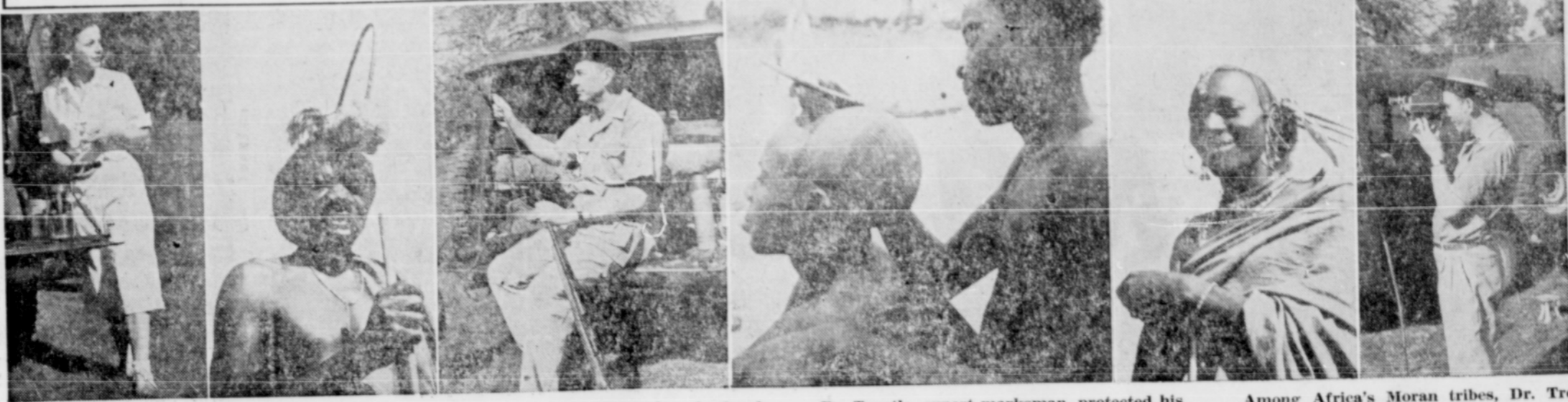

## U. S. Doctor and Wife Make Historical Film Depicting Life of Karamojans



New film, "KARAMOJA," in Eastman color, bringing to the world its first knowledge of the Karamojan tribe of uncivilized people in Africa, was filmed by Dr. and Mrs. Win. B. Treutle, Sebastopol, California citizens.

Petite Mrs. Treutle, whom her husband calls "Small Fry" (left) won friendship of feathered Karamojan ruler (second from left) gaining Treutles entrance to territory forbidden to white man for 6,000 years. Dr. Treutle made only film ever permitted.

Dr. Treutle, expert marksman, protected his wife and himself with firearms. Karamojans' hairdresses are achieved by covering the hair with a color paste and the barber creates ridges to the customer's desire.

Among Africa's Moran tribes, Dr. Treutle filmed the Masai warrior (above). Note his head-piece. Only a Masai warrior who has gone to the jungle alone with his spear and killed a lion, is permitted to wear this.
