

County Ranked Low By Hunters

OREGON CITY—The Clackamas county foothills of the Cascades isn't exactly a deer hunter's paradise. In fact, according to statistics of the state game commission it ranks near the bottom of the list of counties in which a deer season was held.

The statistics recently received from the game commission indicate that 36.8 per cent of the 3670 hunters in the county got game during the last general deer season.

The kill in the county was 926 bucks, 356 does and 67 fawns—or a total of 1,349 deer killed during the season.

Topping the list percentage-wise was Wallowa county with 78.6 of the hunters returning home with game and Multnomah county ranked at the bottom with 23.2 per cent satisfaction.

570 Steelheads Tagged in River

McNARY—Approximately 570 adult steelhead were tagged in the dewatered Oregon shore fishway at McNary dam last week through cooperative efforts of the Corps of Engineers and the Oregon fish commission.

The fish were tagged with small, plastic discs by biologists to learn more of the migratory habits of steelhead in the Columbia river. During a similar operation in January, 464 steelhead were tagged when the Washington shore ladder at McNary was drained for annual repairs.
