Planners Ready Annexing Info For Estacadans

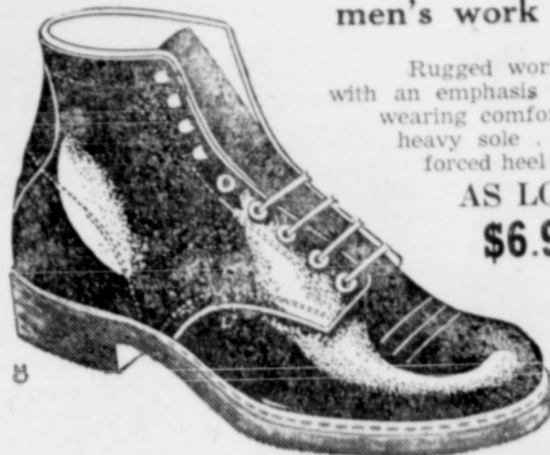
ESTACADA—The city planning commission is gathering facts and laying the groundwork for and annexation of new property north of town.

City planners said the annexation hasn't been proposed, but said they were gathering material in case such a proposal came before it.

At the meeting in the city hall Monday night, the commission heard a report on an area which includes 60 homes and 240 people. Ray Hayden, as part of the report on the annexation problem traced the history of the now-famous supreme court decision which ruled that Estacada could not annex property merely for tax purposes. An annexation of a PGE dam several years ago brought the suit into Clackamas county circuit court and it was appealed to the supreme court by Estacada. Hayden said the supreme court didn't question the legality of the annexation, but evidently questioned the principal of annexation for taxation.
