**NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION IN THE RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT OF CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON, upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution.**

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held Monday, May 16, 1955, by the Rural School District of Clackamas County, State of Oregon, in all component school districts of said Rural School District.

The election will be from 2:00 to 8:00 P.M. for 1st class districts No. 28-Concord, No. 35-Mollala, No. 46-Sandy; and from 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. for 2nd and 3rd class districts; and will be held in the schoolhouse in each of said component districts. The purpose of the election is to submit to the legal voters of the Rural School District the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1955, over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI, of the Oregon Constitution.

The reasons for voting to exceed the 6% limit are:  
1. The base of the Rural School District, which it inherited from its component districts, is too low to furnish money enough for the operation of the schools.  
2. The component districts of the Rural School District, in

most cases, voted over the 6% limit previous to becoming a part of the Rural School District.  
3. The increase in the cost of operating schools is more rapid than a 6% increase will cover. This increase is caused in a large part by the increase in pupil enrollment.

4. In order that there may be sufficient money to operate the schools, the Rural School Board must make a levy in excess of its base.

The amount of tax, in excess

of the six per cent limitation proposed to be levied by the Rural School District of Clackamas County, Oregon, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1955, is \$156,601.71.

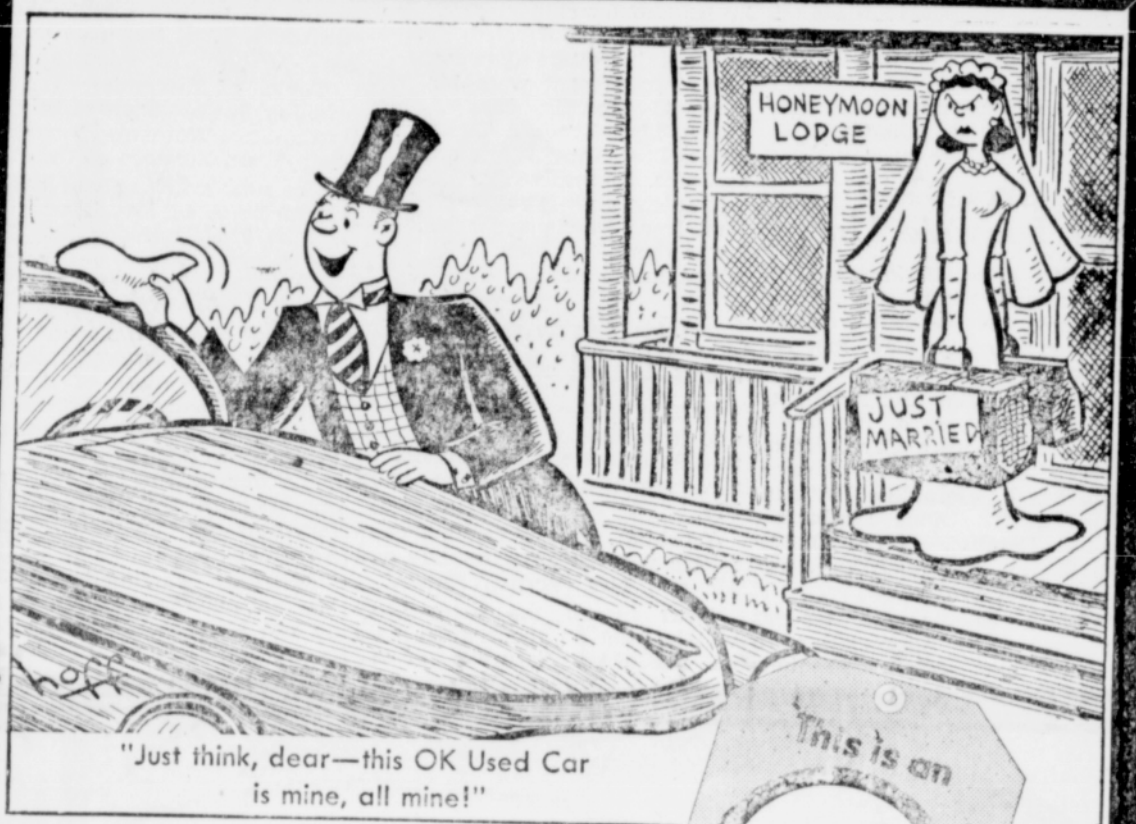
