BORING—Miss Donna Mae Lingle of Boring left from Quebec, Canada, aboard the SS Arosa Star enroute to Greece as an International Farm Youth exchange delegate where she will visit for the next six months.

Miss Lingle will live and work with a farm family while in Greece. She is part of a group of 20 IFYE delegates leaving to visit rural families in nine countries. A total of 76 grass roots ambassadors have left the United States in four groups this month bound for 26 countries in Europe, the Near and Middle East, Latin America and the Pacific. They represent 32 states.

The IFYE project, sponsored by the national 4H club foundation and the cooperative extension service of the US department of agriculture and land grant colleges and universities, is based on the idea that understanding is the basis of peace. As IFYE's selected farm youths from the United States take part in home and farm activities in other countries for four to six months, and youth from those countries come to live with American farm families.

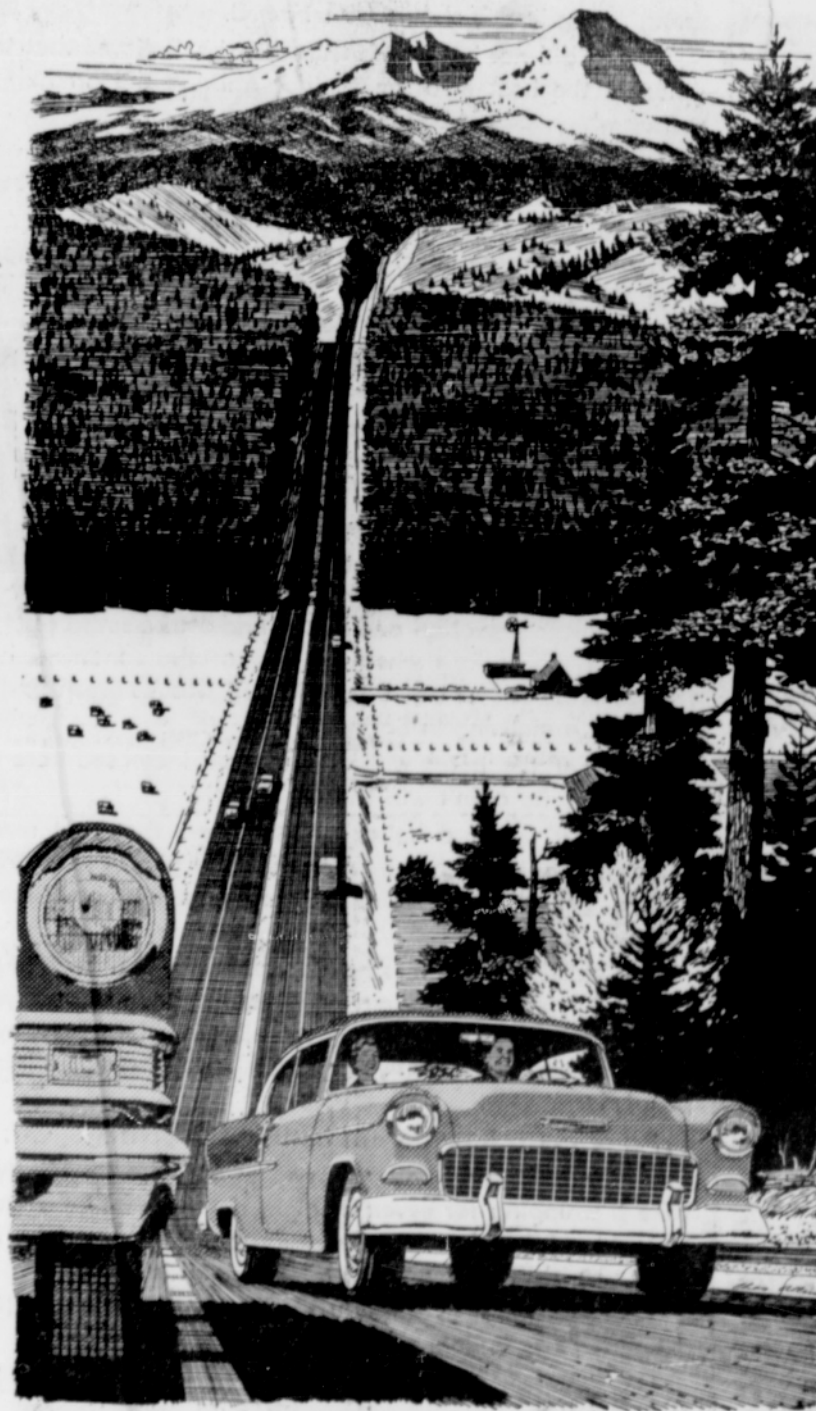
