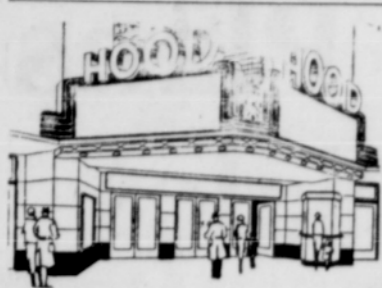

Radio-TV Review By Terry Revenaugh

"The Lawrence Welk Show" made its coast-to-coast television debut on KLOK, Channel 12, Saturday, July 2. Telecast direct from the Aragon Ballroom, in Hollywood, the Welk show runs from 8 to 9 p.m., sponsored by Dodge.
 This enlarges the big Saturday night revue on CBS, from 7 to 8 p.m., when Paul Whiteman brings four big name bands into the camera range. Thus on Saturdays from 7 to 9 p.m., viewers may hear two hours of big band music, broken only intermittently by commercials. It's an unusually quiet and restful period of television.
 Welk and his Champagne Music (pretty sedate and conservative) have been playing nightly from the Aragon at Santa Monica for 190 consecutive weeks. For the last two years they have appeared on a small local station and have consistently been among the top fifteen shows there—even against strong network competition.
 "The Champagne Music" may become over-familiar after too long an exposure but more than a few jaded TV viewers value an hour's quietness. The Welk menage includes: Alice Lon, the Champagne Lady; accordionist Myron Floren; romantic vocalist, Jim Roberts; pianist-vocalist, Larry Hooper; trumpeter and comedy vocalist, Rocky Rockwell; organist Jerry Burke; and the Champagne Glee Club.

 We hope Patti's quit being so darned amiable about her show and has refused outright to let them make an entire "Hit Parade" production out of one girl. We like to hear her sing and we like her pretty face—hope to see and hear a lot of both tonight.
 But for heavens sake! if they have to have dancers we hope they let somebody else do it!

Public Hearing For City Budget Planned Tonight
 ESTACADA—Approval of Estacada's budget for the new 1955-56 fiscal year is expected to be reached without serious opposition at the regular public hearing to be held in conjunction with the regular meeting of the city council tonight.
 The proposed new budget will amount to \$45,027.92, and was kept within the legal 6 per cent limitation by the budget committee. The budget is \$4672.42 higher than the 1954-55 budget, with proposed expenditures for the police and water departments accounting for a good share of the increase.
