The young couple will make their home in Gresham where Pryor is a partner with his father in the Pryor Ambulance Service.

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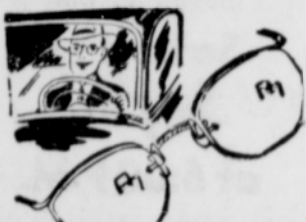

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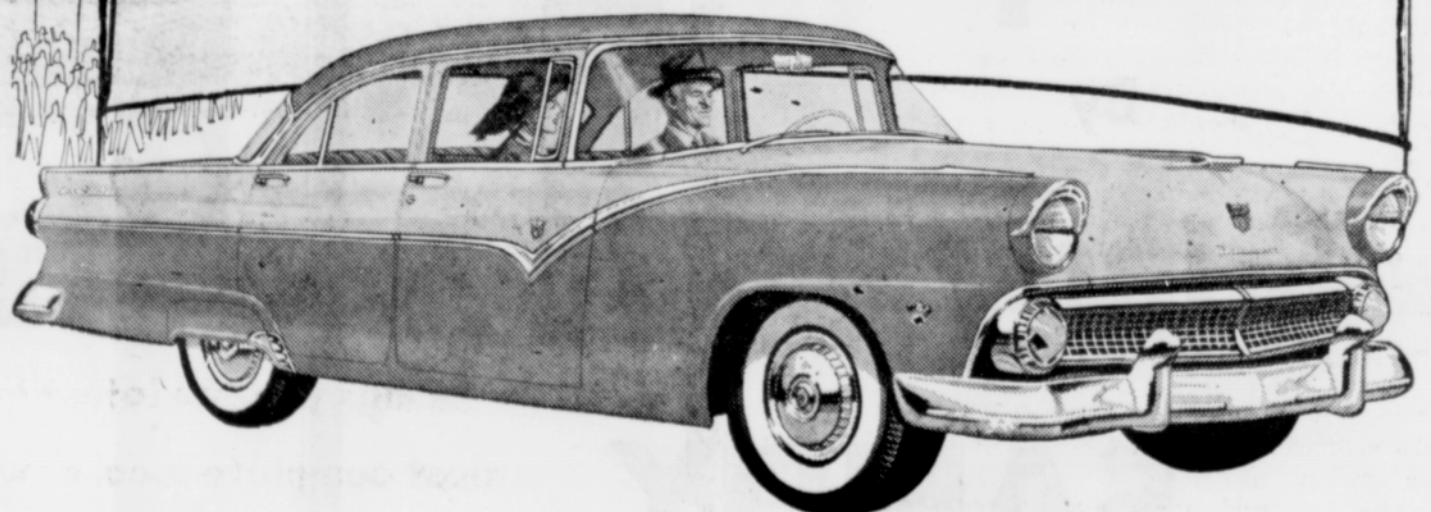
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
