Piling miracle on miracle, the show will utilize 24 cameras and the greatest concentration of electronic equipment ever assembled for a single telecast. If this is pay it is the most elaborate and the most enjoyable. Going to the dogs is pleasant this way.

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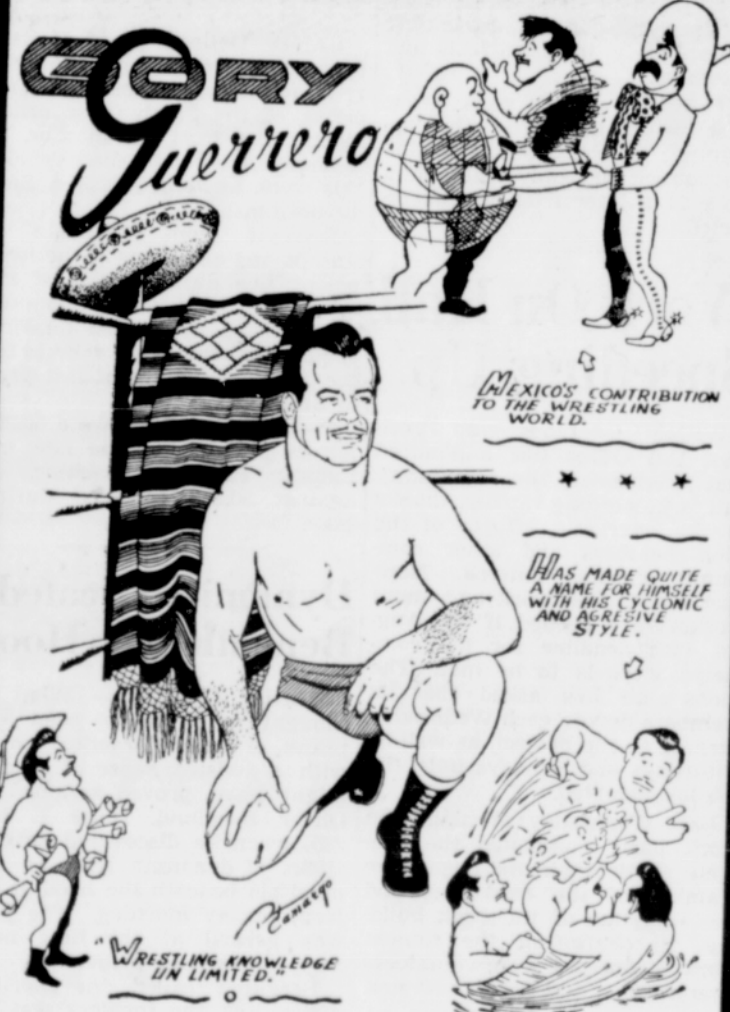
