There were two names read to become members. One by initiation and the other by reinstatement. One candidate, Richard

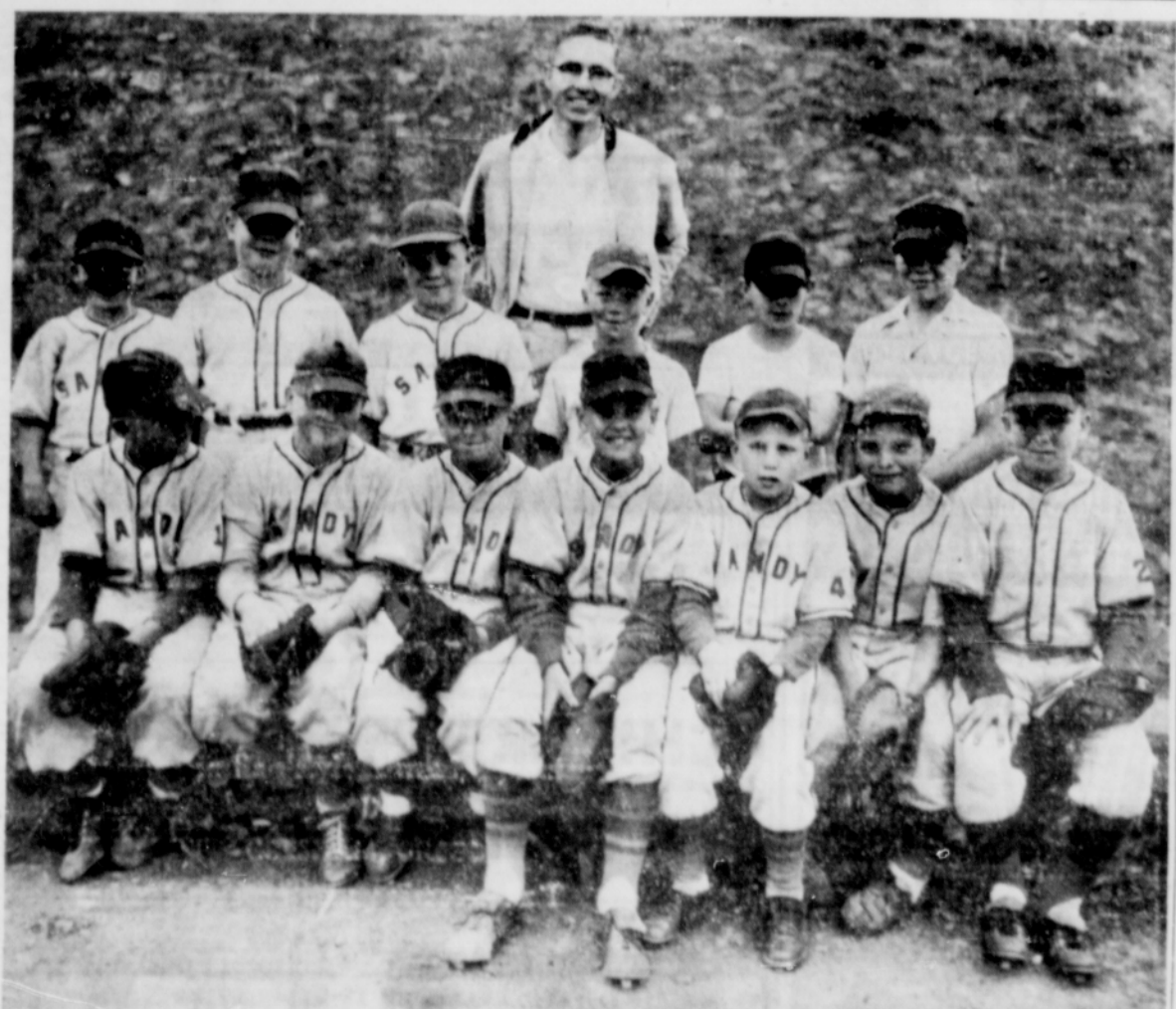
Wetherbee, was obligated in the 1st and 2nd degrees and will be given the degrees in full at a later date.
