4-H CLUB NEWS

One-hundred 4H club members will be leaving Tuesday June 12 for a 10 day session of 4H Club Summer school at Corvallis. Three Milwaukie school buses will be leaving Tuesday morning from different points in the county, Milwaukie, Oregon City and Canby.

Classes will be offered in various phases of home economics and

agriculture. This year a special leadership workshop is being offered club members who are 14 or older. In addition recreation, athletics, and special parties will keep the 4Hers busy from dawn until dark. After dark get-togethers in the group living quarters will provide fun and entertainment.

Each 4H delegate has won a scholarship to attend summer

school through outstanding work in the county.

Gordon Dunham, Corvallis judge for the 4H horse show on June 3 had high praise for the 4H members who participated in the show. He commended them for the improvement which was shown the past few years. Dunham also said that the club members horses were the best group of 4H horses that he had seen in the state.

Credit for the horse show goes to the Silver Spurs 4H Riding club which is led by R.L. Rossiter. This club organized and made all the arrangements for the show. The club members also had a great of help from their parents and others in planning and conducting the show. One of the parents who has worked hard on the show the last few years is Mrs. Carl Staats, of Redland.

The show has made a big growth since the first one was held between three clubs in a private field five years ago. Over one hundred club members sent in entries for this year's show, but because of rain, 65 actually took part.

4-H sheep club members were well represented at the Lamb show on June 2 at the county fairgrounds. Twenty-five 4-H clubbers judged in the sheep and wool judging contest. Eighteen also exhibited fat lambs.

Clive Cook, Jr., Marks Prairie, exhibited the champion 4-H fat lamb. Patricia Steinginger, Molalla, received perfect scores in

three classes of the judging contest to place high in the contest and receive the trophy.

A lot of interest has been shown in 4-H Summer Camp at camp Colton this year and as a result the camp is already filled and the waiting list is growing. A good program is being planned with crafts such as bead work, basketry, fly-tying, nature study, spatter painting and puppetry. We are looking forward to a fun and worthwhile time at Camp Colton. 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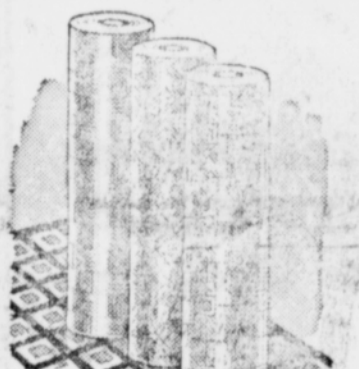
