OGC Resettles Elk Families

Six Roosevelt elk took up homesteads in new surroundings recently as a result of the Oregon Game Commission's big game transplanting program. The elk were captured in the Vaughn mountain elk trap in Douglas county and resettled at the head of Rock Creek in the North Umpqua area. The animals consisted of one mature bull, one bull calf, two adult cows, and two 2-year-old cows. The game commission has high hopes that these animals will be the start of a new herd in the North Umpqua region.

Vaughn mountain has had a large elk population for several years. The trapping and transplanting operations were instigated in hopes that a few animals could be moved to new areas devoid of elk but which stood a good chance of providing new elk herds

for Oregon hunters in the future. Trapping operations have been under the direction of Bob Corthell district game biologist at Coos Bay.
