Beatrice Rasmussen has returned to her home on Cedar Creek after spending the winter in Palm Springs, California.

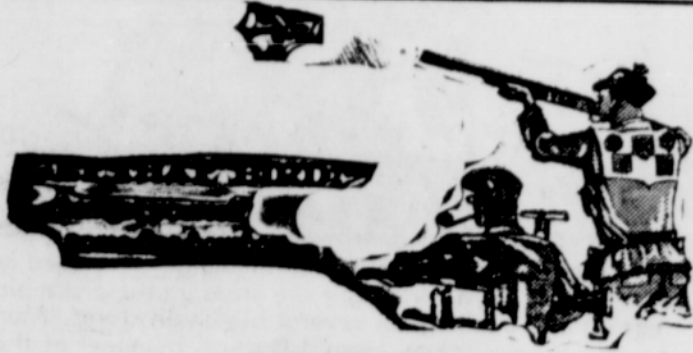

"She does," said the shopkeeper. "And—and whose little girl are you?"

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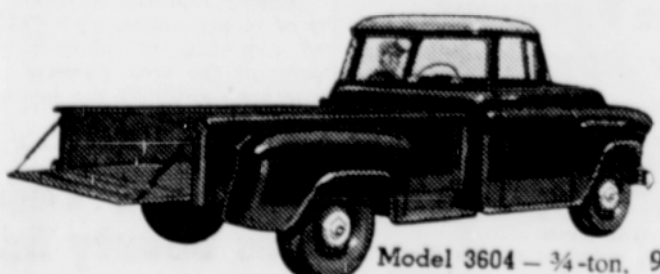
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
