### Ex-Kelso Students Join For Reunion

KELSO—Ex-pupils and teachers of Kelso school gathered Sunday, June 19 for their annual reunion in the former school building, now known as the Sandy Grange hall, with 40 pupils and three teachers present.

Opening the day's program was the serving of a potluck dinner with Mrs. Mildred Decker and Mrs. Dorothy Sanderson in charge.

The program following the dinner hour consisted of reminiscence talks by teachers and pupils with Miss Ruth Baumbach as chairman. Bee Nelson, who has spent his entire life in the community, gave a very interesting account of school days in the old log school house, having begun his education there in 1882.

Teachers present were Mrs. A.C. Baumbach, primary teacher, who began her Oregon teaching there in September 1919, Mrs. Caroline Vaeretti Hauser, principal during the early 1920's and Mrs. Louise Nelson, principal from September 1917 to December 1919, and again from September 1944 to June 1946 when the school was consolidated with the Sandy district.

During the program a moment of silent prayer was observed in memory of Robert Jonsrud, Robert Jari, students during the early days of the school and Mrs. Sophie Barnum, principal some 40 years ago, all having passed away since the last meeting.

### Growers Invited To Membership

Strawberry growers in Clackamas county are invited to make application for membership in the Five-Ton Strawberry club if this year they have obtained yields of five tons per acre on at least five acres, or have marketed at least 25 tons of strawberries from less than five acres. Strawberries sold to processors and fresh markets count towards the yield, according to Leon Garolan, county agent.

For membership in this select group, growers may obtain application forms from the extension office in Oregon City. All bearing acreage is counted in determining average yields on each farm, states Garolan.

Growers who achieve this high production will again be honored at a banquet scheduled for August 10 in Portland.
