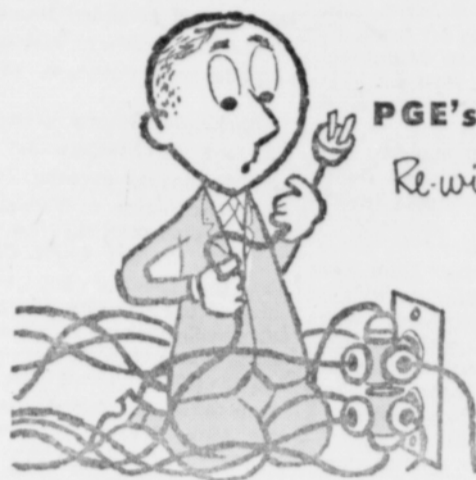
## Barton Locals

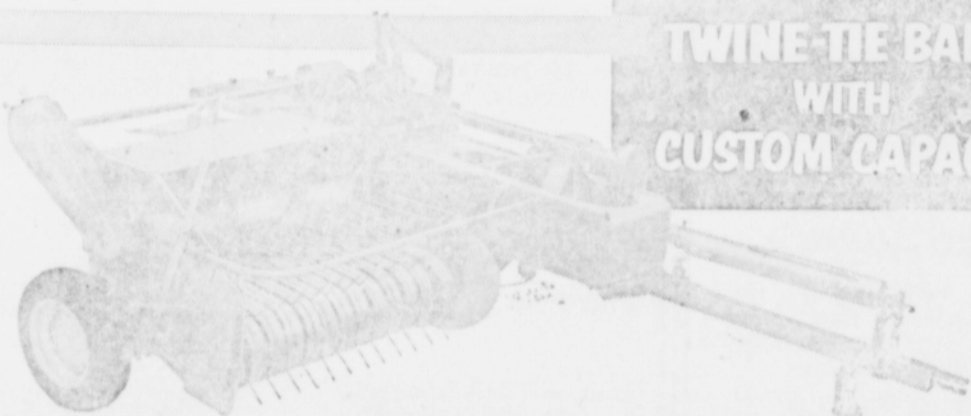

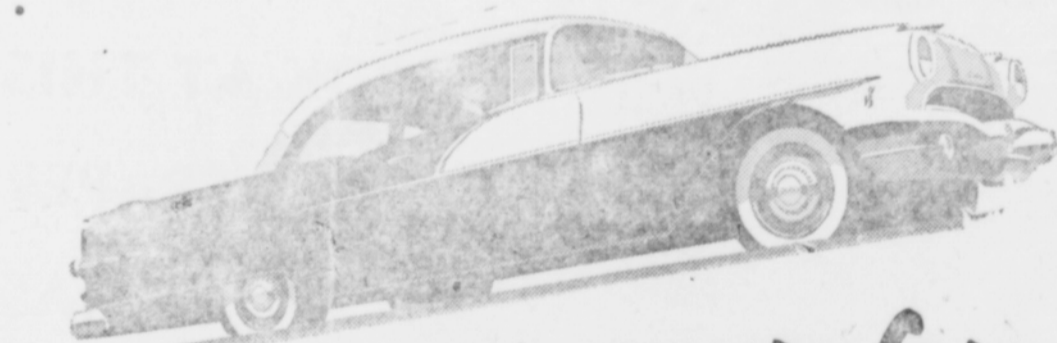
