### 4-H Club Members Convene At OSC For 41st Annual Summer School

SANDY—Patty Radford of Sandy was elected social chairman for her living organization at 4-H summer school now in session at Oregon State college, Corvallis. Enrollment figures were up this year, according to Burton Hutton, state extension leader, with 1243 girls and 623 boys registered for classes. The boys and girls attending the 41st annual event live in 43 different units, including fraternity and sorority houses and college dormitories.

Each living group has its own set of officers and carries out its own special projects, under supervision of advisors. The 43 house presidents make up a special council that considers general problems and procedures.

Special features of this year's summer school are new classes leadership training, an increased athletic program and a craft workshop.

Almost 400 club members were enrolled in a special workshop for training young leaders. Helps were presented in camp counseling, leading younger club members, and conducting meetings all important phases of the 4-H

junior leadership project. Largest delegations represented were Washington county with 100 club members, Portland with 99 and Clackamas county, 97.

During their 10-day stay in Corvallis, 4-h'ers attended morning classes in agriculture, home economics, forestry, science, civi defense, health and farm safety. Afternoons were devoted to sports activities, band, chorus, crafts and social dancing. Swimming, softball, volleyball and track were included in the boys' athletic program.

SANDY—Herman W. Seematter, a resident of Route 1, Box 381, Boring, passed away at the Veteran's hospital in Portland Thursday, June 14 following an illness of several months.

Seematter was born April 8, 1899 at Marysville, Kansas, son of John and Rosa Seematter. His father was a native of Switzerland and his mother was born in Germany. He spent his early childhood on a farm in Kansas. He was married at Ritzville, Washington.

On October 19, 1942 he joined the 8th Army Air Corps at Los Angeles, California and attained the rank of staff sergeant.

He served in England as MP for 18 months and was honorably discharged on August 23, 1945. He also received the European-African-Middle Eastern service medal and good conduct medal. He lived at Ritzville, Washington for a short time then decided to settle in Oregon on a berry farm.

He is survived by his wife Marie, daughter Bethel Irene Adams of Santa Ana, California; and son John Herman of Van Nuys California; sisters, Anna Ring, Marysville, Kansas; Rosa Scholz, Frankfurt, Kansas and brothers, Ernest of Home, Kansas; Albert and Paul of Sunnymeade, California.
