NEWS STORY: KPTV has this filed a modification to its application for VHF Channel 3 it was announced by the station's managing director, F.G. Riordan. The modification would situate the Ch. 3 station in Salem, where it would basically be a Salem station, but would serve the entire Willamette Valley, including Portland.

The main studios would be located in Salem and programming will be altered to serve the entire Willamette Valley. With definite plans to go up to absolute maximum power, the station would give service to about 1,400,000 people. This would mean an earlier sign-on and addition of a farm director to the staff, along with other changes to coincide with the needs of the added areas covered.

The transmitter site for the Salem operation has already been purchased. The modification filed today provides for the highest tower on the West Coast, well over 500 feet higher, with a span of 1349 feet.

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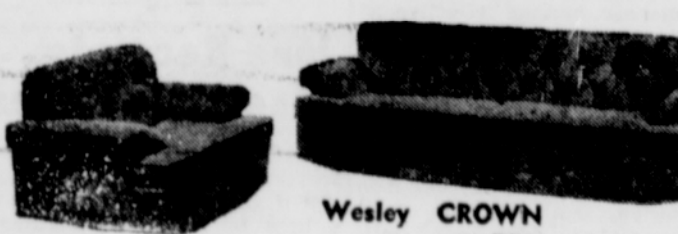
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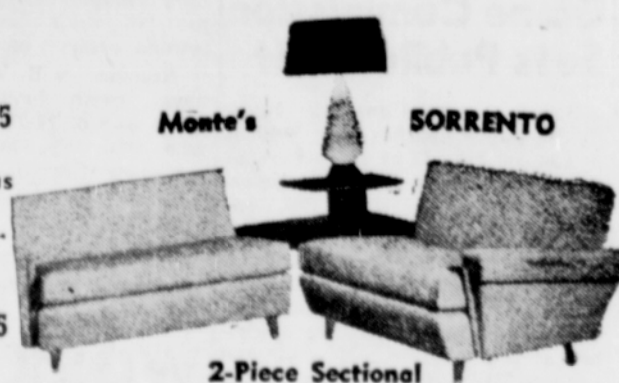
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
