RADIO NEWS—KGIN radio this week began a series of sports programs emceed by Hal Childs. The new show is "Sportsweek" to be heard each Saturday from 3 to 3:55 P.M. Childs, a veteran of nine years in the sports field at the age of 23, will work in close union with Johnny Carpenter, sports director, in compiling the 55 minute broadcast.

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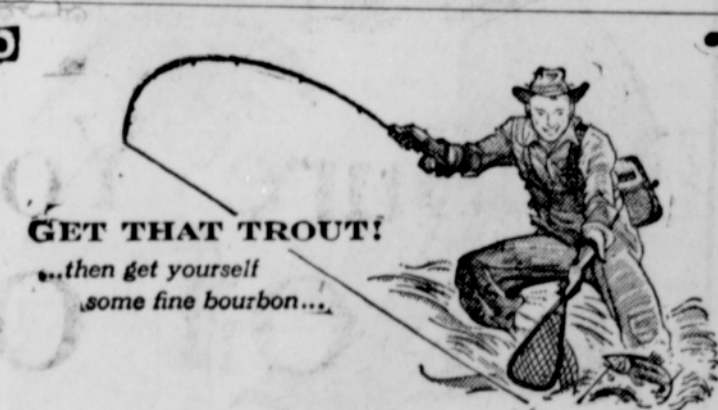
