

Evangelist Due At Damascus

DAMASCUS — Evangelist John J. Penner of South Gate, California, will preach at Damascus Community Church seven evenings starting November 4 to 11 inclusive at 8 p. m. The Reverend Penner was born in Russia of Holland-Dutch extraction. He received

his academic and theological training in that country. He went through the Revolution and served in World War II. His father was killed and also one of his brothers was executed at the outset of the revolution. Penner, himself, was led away to be tried, but miraculously was spared and finally was allowed to leave the country.

After 20 years of silence from behind the "Iron Curtain", recently he has received news that another brother has been executed, also three nephews who were medical doctors, have been executed. His four brothers-in-law have become victims of Communism.

Penner came to this country in 1923 and has served as pastor in various churches and has been holding evangelistic meetings here as well as abroad. For the last four years he has served as chaplain in the Harbor General Hospital at Torrance, California.

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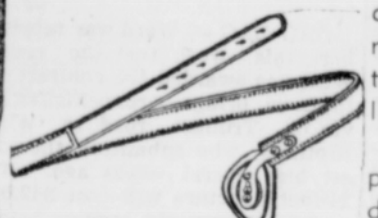
